WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires the Governor to determine the security requirements necessary to safely carry out the extradition of a person from another state.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Governor's Office can on a case-by-case basis, confer with the State Police
- Relieves the State Police Superintendent from a statutory requirement that is not within the scope of the superintendent's position

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Extradition is the process of removing a person from this state to face criminal charges in another state or seeking to remove a person from another state to face charges in this state. ORS 133.743 to 133.857 sets forth the process and procedure for extradition in Oregon. Extradition is primarily the function of the Governor with one exception. Subject to the determination of the Governor, the Superintendent of the State Police determines the security requirements necessary to safely carry out an extradition of a person from another state.
