**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Permits home care worker, who is a party in a Department of Human Services' (DHS) contested case hearing, to be represented by a labor union representative. Establishes labor union representative's scope of representation.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Whether the union could provide a private attorney to represent the worker
- Current limitations on participation of a non-attorney authorized representative in a DHS hearing
- Possible inclusion of DHS in agencies listed in ORS 183.457 allowing participation by an authorized representative

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Under current law, a home care worker in a contested case hearing has the right to be represented by an attorney. Under SB 383, the worker would have the right to be represented by a representative of the worker's union, who might, or might not be an attorney.
