WHAT THE BILL DOES: Allows counties to serve notice of required personal property tax delinquency warrants by means of one publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county and by first-class mail to persons named in notice, replacing a method of notice that uses four consecutive weekly publications in a newspaper of general circulation in the county. Increases fee for service of personal property tax delinquency warrant from \$15 to \$20. Takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the regular session of the 75th Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Three ways of serving personal property tax delinquency warrants
- · Cost effective way of delivering warrants
- Effectiveness of using certified mail to serve warrants
- Privacy issues related to using newspaper publication
- How often warrants are issued for business property

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

BACKGROUND: ORS 311.615 states that notice of warrants to enforce payments of taxes on personal property can be given by four consecutive weekly publications in a newspaper of general circulation in the county.

Current service fee for personal property tax delinquency warrant is \$15. \$15 fee has not been changed since 1983. The statewide number of served warrants is estimated to be 16,843 for FY 2007-08.
