WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Modifies proof required to grant a motion to intervene in juvenile court proceeding to make it consistent with requirements for filing a motion to intervene.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions of the measure

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: This measure, requested by the Oregon Law Commission, corrects an error that was part of the juvenile law revision process in 2005. To intervene in a juvenile dependency proceeding a party must show several factors. The factors that the parties must prove to intervene in a juvenile dependency proceeding inadvertently did not align with the factors for filing a motion. SB 559 makes the factors identical.
