WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: SB 5528 ratifies application fees for the Occupational Therapy Licensing Board that were changed by administrative rule in January 2007. This bill makes offsetting adjustments of \$20 to in-state and out of state Occupational Therapist application fees, so that both fees are \$100. The bill also makes offsetting adjustments of \$10 to Occupational Therapist Assistant application fees, so that both fees are \$70.

SB 5528 results in a net a reduction of \$3,060 in fee revenue to the Board in the 2009-11 biennium. The Board has an ending balance of almost one biennium of operating cost, and reduced fees in the 2008 license renewal cycle.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- The process for changing fees and fee ratification

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: The purpose of these fee changes is to make the application fee uniform regardless of the residency of the applicant. This change was made because most applicants are from out-of-state, since there is only one Occupational Therapy school in Oregon.
