EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Senior Trooper William Robert Hakim died in the line of duty on December 12, 2008 as the result of a bomb explosion at a Woodburn-area bank. Born in New York City, William's family moved to Spain and Italy before settling in Mexico City. After finishing high school, William attended St. John's College and, upon leaving college, enlisted in the United State Navy where he served for 12 years. While in the Navy he achieved one his proudest accomplishments: becoming an Explosive Ordinance Disposal Diver.

After leaving the Navy in 1994, William and his family moved to the Northwest, where he graduated from the Oregon Public Safety Academy and joined the Oregon State Police (OSP). His first assignment as a state trooper was in Klamath Falls. In 1999, he transferred to the Arson & Explosives Section as an arson detective and Certified Hazardous Device Technician. In addition, he served with the OSP SWAT team and taught arson and bomb investigations.

In 1989, William married his wife, Terri Milling and had two children, daughter Page and son Victor. An avid outdoorsman, William shared this passion with his family through travel and recreation.
