Summary of Revenue Changes

House Bill 5006 allocates revenues from the Criminal Fine and Assessment Account. These revenues are collected from fines, assessments, and other financial penalties, including the Unitary Assessment, imposed on conviction for felonies, misdemeanors, and violations other than parking infractions.

Summary of Public Safety Subcommittee Action

House Bill 5006 is the vehicle for allocation of revenues from the Criminal Fine and Assessment Account (CFAA) according to the priorities specified in ORS 137.302. Funds may be, but not required to be, allocated according to the following priorities, with remaining, unallocated funds deposited in the General Fund:

- Public safety standards, training, and facilities;
- Crime victims' programs;
- State Police Forensics services and the State Medical Examiner;
- Maintenance and operation of the Law Enforcement Data System.

Expenditure limitations for programs receiving CFAA allocations are established in the separate appropriation bills for the various receiving agencies.

For the 2009-11 biennium, the total amount expected to be deposited into CFAA is estimated at \$114.6 million. The Legislature approved allocations to agencies totaling \$50.9 million (44.4 percent of available CFAA revenues), leaving a balance of \$63.6 million (55.6 percent of available CFAA revenues) to be deposited in the General Fund.

Allocation of Criminal Fine and Assessment Account Public Safety Fund
