Summary of Revenue Changes

There are no revenue forecast changes, fee ratifications, revenue source changes or other significant revenue actions.

Summary of Education Subcommittee Action

The Subcommittee approved a budget for the Board of Chiropractic Examiners of \$1,295,037 Other Funds and 4.50 full-time equivalent positions. This is a 12 percent increase from the 2007-09 Legislatively Approved Budget.

If House Bill 2241 becomes law, the Board should return to the Legislative Assembly for additional limitation for increased board member per diem. The Board currently pays board members \$30 per day. If House Bill 2241 is enacted, the Board intends to increase board member pay to \$109 per day, consistent with federal per diem guidelines.
