LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

ANALYSIS: This bill creates the State Judicial Stabilization Fund, creates new fees and service charges, increases or expands certain fees and charges, and increases base fines. According to an opinion from Legislative Counsel, this bill will require approval by a three-fifths majority because it is considered a revenue raising bill.

This bill will raise approximately \$40.0 million to pay the expenses to maintain a stable and equitable state court system. This bill currently has a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of this measure's budgetary impact on the State's General Fund.
