LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

ANALYSIS: This measure requires Legislative Counsel to solicit bids for the printing of all editions of the Oregon Revised Statutes that follow the 2009 Edition.

The cost of the bidding process is approximately \$1,834 for the 2010 Annotations Supplement and \$35,464 for the 2011 Oregon Revised Statutes. These estimates are based on the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) Publishing and Distribution Division contract administration fee of eight percent of the overall contract cost, the printing price of the 2007 edition of the Oregon Revised Statutes, and the printing price of 2008 Annotations Supplement. Note that the eight percent contract fee does not include attorney general fees. However, DAS estimates attorney general costs to be minimal.

Currently, Legislative Counsel has a multi-edition contract with a printer with an option to renew with notice by November 15 following publication of the even-year Annotations Supplement. The printing and binding charges are reviewed and adjusted every two years on the date of the contract at the rate of the Producer Price Index for Manufacturing.
