EFFECTIVE DATE: January 1, 2010

GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS: HB 2753 has a minimal, indeterminate, fiscal impact on local government.

HB 2753 authorizes changes in pawnbroker fees, and authorizes the maximum fee that local government can charge pawnbrokers for enforcement of local government regulations. The League of Oregon Cities reports that the City of Eugene is the only city that imposes a pawnbroker fee. The bill increases the limit above the fees that the City of Eugene currently charges, and would only have an impact if cities needed to raise fees far beyond what is authorized.
