EFFECTIVE DATE: January 1, 2010

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

ANALYSIS: Operative July 1, 2010, this measure establishes the Private Child-Caring Agencies Fund to receive moneys from civil penalties on a private child-caring agency and such other moneys as may be otherwise made available by law. Moneys in the Private Child-Caring Agencies Fund are continuously appropriated to the Department of Human Services and must be used only for the administration and enforcement of licensing and supervision of private child-caring agencies.

The fiscal impact on the Department of Human Services if this bill is enacted is indeterminate at this time. Depending on the number of civil penalties, passage of this bill could require additional staffing to issue penalties and track subsequent collections from penalties.
