LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS: The bill establishes a pilot product stewardship program for paint, which would require producers to provide for collection of unused (postconsumer) paint and to implement strategies to reduce the generation of postconsumer paint and to promote reuse; establishes program conditions that include submitting a plan to the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ); establishes that the program is subject to regulatory supervision of DEQ; directs that DEQ may not disclose data reported by stewardship organizations; allows DEQ to issue an order requiring compliance; directs DEQ to charge a fee of \$10,000 upon plan submission and an annual fee of \$10,000; establishes the Product Stewardship Fund which is continuously appropriated to DEQ; directs DEQ to report to the Legislature on the pilot, modifications and administration of fees; repeals the pilot on June 30, 2014; and directs that any money remaining the Product Stewardship Fund on June 30, 2014 be transferred to the General Fund.

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from House Committee on Sustainability and Economic Development to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
