**MEASURE NUMBER:** HB 3059

**STATUS:** A-Engrossed

**SUBJECT:** Requires the Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems Program within the Department of Human Services to maintain the Oregon Trauma Registry. Requires the Director of the Program to adopt rules for the Registry. Authorizes the Department to provide data from the Registry to certain entities for public health purposes.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** On Passage

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE:** This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**ANALYSIS:** This measure requires the Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Systems Program within the Department of Human Services (DHS) to maintain the Oregon Trauma Registry. It also requires the Director of the Program to adopt rules for the Registry. The bill authorizes DHS to provide data from the Registry to certain entities for public health purposes.

Both the Oregon Health and Science University and the Department of Human Services state that passage of this bill will have no fiscal impact on the Department. Maintenance of the Registry and adoption of rules fall within existing ongoing program activities for both agencies.
