**EFFECTIVE DATE:** On passage

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE:** This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**ANALYSIS:** The measure provides that (a) any General Fund appropriation by the Legislative Assembly for the purpose of supporting graduate medical education at the Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) School of Medicine must be used for the training of primary care medical residents or for primary care training programs; (b) any hospital that receives moneys from a General Fund appropriation for graduate medical education or that receives funding from the Department of Human Services (DHS) to support graduate medical education shall pay each primary care medical resident a salary that meets the requirements of this measure.

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Human Services Committee to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. The fiscal impact of this measure on OHSU and DHS has not yet been determined.

A complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
