GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

ANALYSIS: Current law states that the license fee for dietary licenses issued for 12 months or less shall be one-half of the two-year license fees. This measure modifies the license fee for a dietary license issued for a period of less than 24 months to be prorated on a monthly basis.

There is no expenditure impact from this measure. The Board of Dietitians estimates a reduction in licensing revenue of \$3,500 for the 2009-2011 biennium and a similar estimate for 2011-2013. This estimate is based on the Board's historical records of dates of licensure. The Board has a projected ending balance of \$99,650. Therefore the reduction of revenue can be absorbed by the Board's ending balance without a corresponding reduction of expenditures.
