EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill contains an emergency clause and is effective on passage.

GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS:

SB 578 establishes a Task Force on All-Terrain Vehicle Safety, consisting of 12 members. Five members are appointed by the Governor, and seven members are appointed by the Director of Transportation. The Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD) will provide staff support to the Task Force. The Task Force is directed to report its findings to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly by no later than October 1, 2010.

The fiscal impact of the bill is minimal, and includes costs related to member per diem, staff support, and the cost to generate the required report. The bill provides that Task Force members are to be compensated for per diem expenses "out of funds appropriated" for these expenses. However, the bill does not provide an appropriation to OPRD for these expenses.
