EFFECTIVE DATE: This bill includes an emergency clause and is effective July 1, 2009

GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

ANALYSIS: SB 5528 ratifies application fees that were changed by administrative rule in January, 2007. The purpose of these fee changes is to make the application fee uniform regardless of the residency of the applicant. This change was made because most applicants are from out-of-state, since there is only one Occupational Therapy school in Oregon.
