EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2009

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS: The measure ratifies fee increases adopted through administrative rule by the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) during the 2007 interim and approved by the Department of Administrative Services per Oregon Revised Statute 291.055. The statute requires all new state agency fees or fee increases adopted by rule after July 1 of any odd-numbered year to be rescinded on July 1 of the next biennium unless authorized by enabling legislation. This measure is that legislation and would go into effect on July 1, 2009.

The measure ratifies two fee increases for mailed notice subscriptions that went into effect on July 1, 2008. These fees have not been increased since they were established in 1982. Fee change details and associated revenues are outlined in the table below.
