Allows the State Board of Forestry to designate and manage areas on state forestlands as natural resource conservation areas. Allows the Board and Department of State Lands to designate and manage areas on Common School Forest Lands and Elliott State Forest Lands as natural resource conservation areas. Directs the State Forester to manage conservation areas for specific purposes, including low-impact public uses, using designated management activities. Defines low-impact public uses.

With current legislation, the Board presumably has authority to classify land as natural resource conservation areas and this is similar to its Special Stewardship classification. Management activity requirements in conservation areas are similar to current practices, but there are specific restrictions that may impact revenue.
