SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Specifies amount of income from Common School Fund that Department of State Lands must transfer each calendar year to Superintendent of Public Instruction for apportionment among counties and school districts.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Common School Fund; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 327.410.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 327.410 is amended to read:

5 327.410. (1) The Department of State Lands shall transfer [the balance of] annually an amount

6 **described in subsection (2) of this section from** the Distributable Income Account of the Common

7 School Fund established under ORS 273.105, after deductions authorized by law, to the Superinten-

8 dent of Public Instruction [semiannually, or more frequently if the State Land Board so orders].

9 (2)(a) The Department of State Lands shall transfer to the Superintendent of Public In-10 struction an amount equal to five percent of the average balance of the Common School 11 Fund over the previous three calendar years. The average balance of the Common School 12 Fund over the previous three calendar years shall be determined as of the last day of the 13 calendar year for each of the three preceding calendar years.

(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, if there is not a sufficient amount
 in the Distributable Income Account to make the transfer required by paragraph (a) of this
 subsection, the department shall transfer to the superintendent the balance of the Distributable Income Account.

(3) The superintendent shall immediately apportion the amount transferred under subsections
(1) and (2) of this section among the counties in proportion to the number of children resident in
each county between the ages of 4 and 20 as determined pursuant to ORS 190.510 to 190.610.

(4) The superintendent shall distribute to each school district within a county a share of the county's apportionment that is based on the district's average daily membership that resides within the county.

24 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 327.410 by section 1 of this 2009 Act apply to 25 transfers made by the Department of State Lands from the Distributable Income Account 26 to the Superintendent of Public Instruction on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
