## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Directs State Board of Higher Education and community college district boards to permit Oregon residents 65 years of age or older to audit courses without paying instructional fees at any state institution of higher education or community college.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to auditing higher education courses. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. The State Board of Higher Education shall permit Oregon residents 65 years 4 of age or older to audit, without fee, an unlimited number of courses at any institution of 5 higher education under the board's control if: 6 7 (1) There is space available in the course; and 8 (2) The instructor approves. SECTION 2. A community college district board shall permit Oregon residents 65 years 9 of age or older to audit, without fee, an unlimited number of courses at any community 10 college under the board's control if: 11 12 (1) There is space available in the course; and 13 (2) The instructor approves. SECTION 3. The provisions of sections 1 and 2 of this 2009 Act shall first apply to courses 14
