

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL 2020

1 On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon insert “creating new
2 provisions; amending ORS 390.560;”.

3 On page 2, delete lines 32 through 43 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding ORS 390.560, the amount of \$350,000 is transferred from
5 the All-Terrain Vehicle Account of the State Parks and Recreation Department Fund to the
6 Invasive Species Control Account.**

7 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
8 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter __, Oregon Laws 2009 (Enrolled Senate
9 Bill 5502), for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of ex-
10 penses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding
11 lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Department of Agriculture,
12 is increased by \$350,000 for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of section 2 of this 2009
13 Act.**

14 **“SECTION 5.** ORS 390.560 is amended to read:

15 “390.560. Moneys in the All-Terrain Vehicle Account established under ORS 390.555 shall be
16 used for the following purposes only:

17 “(1) In each 12-month period, no less than 10 percent of the moneys described in ORS 390.555
18 that are attributable to Class I all-terrain vehicles shall be transferred to the Department of
19 Transportation for the development and maintenance of snowmobile facilities as provided in ORS
20 802.110;

21 “(2) Planning, promoting and implementing a statewide all-terrain vehicle program, including the
22 acquisition, development and maintenance of all-terrain vehicle recreation areas;

23 “(3) Education and safety training for all-terrain vehicle operators;

24 “(4) Provision of first aid and police services in all-terrain vehicle recreation areas designated
25 by the appropriate authority;

26 “(5) Paying the costs of instigating, developing or promoting new programs for all-terrain vehicle
27 users and of advising people of possible usage areas for all-terrain vehicles;

28 “(6) Paying the costs of coordinating between all-terrain vehicle user groups and the managers
29 of public lands;

30 “(7) Paying the costs of providing consultation and guidance to all-terrain vehicle user programs;

31 “(8) Paying the costs of administration of the all-terrain vehicle programs, including staff sup-
32 port provided under ORS 390.565 as requested by the All-Terrain Vehicle Account Allocation Com-
33 mittee; [and]

34 “(9) Paying the costs of law enforcement activities related to the operation of Class I and Class
III all-terrain vehicles. The State Parks and Recreation Department shall determine the amount

1 required for law enforcement activities and the intervals at which the moneys shall be distributed.
2 The funds available shall be apportioned according to the terms of an intergovernmental agreement
3 entered into between the State Parks and Recreation Department and a city, the Department of
4 State Police or the sheriff of a county[.]; **and**

5 **“(10) Control and eradication of invasive species related to all-terrain vehicle**
6 **recreation.”.**

7 In line 44, delete “5” and insert “6”.

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
