SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Expands kidnapping in first degree to include kidnapping with purpose of committing sex crime against victim who is under 12 years of age.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to kidnapping; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 163.235.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 163.235 is amended to read:
- 5 163.235. (1) A person commits the crime of kidnapping in the first degree if the person violates

6 ORS 163.225 with any of the following purposes:

- 7 (a) To compel any person to pay or deliver money or property as ransom;
- 8 (b) To hold the victim as a shield or hostage;
- 9 (c) To cause physical injury to the victim; [or]
- 10 (d) To terrorize the victim or another person; or
- 11 (e) To further the commission or attempted commission of any of the following crimes

12 against the victim:

- 13 (A) Rape in the first degree, as defined in ORS 163.375 (1)(b);
- 14 (B) Sodomy in the first degree, as defined in ORS 163.405 (1)(b); or
- 15 (C) Unlawful sexual penetration in the first degree, as defined in ORS 163.411 (1)(b).
- 16 (2) Kidnapping in the first degree is a Class A felony.
- 17 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 163.235 by section 1 of this 2009 Act apply to of-
- 18 fenses committed on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
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
