House Bill 2377

Sponsored by Representative TOMEI (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Prohibits person of any age from operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device except under certain circumstances.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to use of mobile communication device while driving; amending ORS 811.507.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 811.507 is amended to read:
5	811.507. (1) A person [under 18 years of age] commits the offense of operating a motor vehicle
6	while using a mobile communication device if the person, while operating a motor vehicle on a
7	highway, uses a mobile communication device. [and the person holds:]
8	[(a) A provisional driver license issued under ORS 807.065;]
9	[(b) A special student driver permit issued under ORS 807.230; or]
10	[(c) An instruction driver permit issued under ORS 807.280.]
11	(2) For purposes of this section[,]:
12	(a) "Hands-free accessory" means an attachment or built-in feature for or an addition
13	to a mobile communication device, whether or not permanently installed in a motor vehicle,
14	that when used allows a person to maintain both hands on the steering wheel.
15	(b) "Mobile communication device" means a text messaging device or a wireless, two-way com-
16	munication device designed to receive and transmit voice or text communication.
17	(3) This section does not apply:
18	(a) To a person who is summoning medical or other emergency help if no other person in the
19	vehicle is capable of summoning help; [or]
20	(b) To a person using a mobile communication device for the purpose of farming or agricultural

- (c) To a person operating an ambulance or emergency vehicle; or
- (d) To a person using a hands-free accessory.
- [(4) Notwithstanding ORS 810.410, a police officer may enforce this provision only as a secondary action when a driver of a motor vehicle has been detained for a suspected traffic violation or some other offense.]
- [(5)] (4) The offense described in this section, operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile communication device, is a Class D traffic violation.
