SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Task Force on Extending Washington County Commuter Rail to Salem. Sunsets task force on date of convening of next regular biennial legislative session.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to commuter rail.

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3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Task Force on Extending Washington County 5 Commuter Rail to Salem consisting of 17 members as follows:
- 6 (a) One member who is the Representative of the Fifth Congressional District of Oregon
 7 or the Representative's designee.
- 8 (b) Two members of the Senate, one of whom is a Democrat and one of whom is a Re-9 publican, who shall be appointed by the President of the Senate.
- (c) Two members of the House of Representatives, one of whom is a Democrat and one
 of whom is a Republican, who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(d) One member who is a representative of the Portland and Western Railroad, and who
 shall be appointed by the Department of Transportation. The department shall consider per sons from a list submitted to the department by the Portland and Western Railroad.

- (e) One member who is a representative of Tri-Met, as defined in ORS 267.334, and who
 shall be appointed by the Tri-Met governing body.
- (f) One member who is a representative of Washington County government, and who
 shall be appointed by the Washington County Board of Commissioners.
- (g) One member who is a representative of Marion County government, and who shall
 be appointed by the Marion County Board of Commissioners.
- 22 (h) The administrator of the Rail Division of the Department of Transportation.
- 23 (i) The mayor of Beaverton or the designee of the mayor of Beaverton.
- 24 (j) The mayor of Wilsonville or the designee of the mayor of Wilsonville.
- 25 (k) The mayor of Keizer or the designee of the mayor of Keizer.
- 26 (L) The mayor of Salem or the designee of the mayor of Salem.
- (m) One member who is a representative of the Salem Area Mass Transit District, and
 who shall be appointed by the Cherriots Board of Directors.
- 29 (n) The mayor of Donald or the designee of the mayor of Donald.
- 30 (o) The mayor of Woodburn or the designee of the mayor of Woodburn.
- 31 (2) The task force shall:

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| 1 | (a) Explore the possibility of extending the Washington County Commuter Rail from |
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| 2 | Wilsonville to Salem; and |
| 3 | (b) Develop a program designed to generate interest and activity in extending the |
| 4 | commuter line. |
| 5 | (3) The task force may: |
| 6 | (a) Research the need for an extension of the Washington County Commuter Rail; |
| 7 | (b) Identify the actions that are necessary to extend the Washington County Commuter |
| 8 | Rail to Salem; |
| 9 | (c) Evaluate the results of its findings under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection; |
| 10 | and |
| 11 | (d) Submit recommendations for legislation for presession filing to an appropriate interim |
| 12 | committee no later than October 1, 2010. All legislation recommended by official action of the |
| 13 | task force must indicate that it is introduced at the request of the task force. |
| 14 | (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction |
| 15 | of business. |
| 16 | (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members |
| 17 | of the task force. |
| 18 | (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. |
| 19 | (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint- |
| 20 | ment to become immediately effective. |
| 21 | (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson |
| 22 | or of a majority of the members of the task force. |
| 23 | (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. |
| 24 | (10) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor, the |
| 25 | Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate in the manner |
| 26 | provided by ORS 192.245 no later than October 1, 2010. |
| 27 | (11) The Legislative Administration Committee shall provide staff support to the task |
| 28 | force. |
| 29 | (12) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the |
| 30 | Legislative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volun- |
| 31 | teers on the task force. Other members of the task force are not entitled to compensation |
| 32 | or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force. |
| 33 | (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist |
| 34 | the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating |
| 35 | to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force |
| 36 | consider necessary to perform their duties. |
| 37 | (14) The task force shall have its first meeting no later than 60 days after the effective |
| 38 | date of this 2009 Act. |
| 39 | SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next |
| 40 | regular biennial legislative session. |
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
