SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies crime of possession of gambling device.

A BILL FOR AN ACT
Relating to gambling devices; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 167.147.
Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
SECTION 1. ORS 167.147 is amended to read:
167.147. (1) A person commits the crime of possession of a gambling device if, with knowledge
of the character thereof, the person manufactures, sells, transports, places or possesses, or conducts
or negotiates a transaction affecting or designed to affect ownership, custody or use of:
(a) A slot machine; or
(b) Any other gambling device, believing that the device is to be used in promoting unlawful
gambling activity.
(2) Possession of a gambling device is a Class A misdemeanor.
(3) It is a defense to a charge of [possession of a gambling device] violating subsection (1) of
this section if the slot machine or gambling device that caused the charge to be brought was
manufactured:
(a) Prior to 1900 and is not operated for purposes of unlawful gambling; or
[(b) More than 25 years before the date on which the charge was brought and:]
[(A) Is located in a private residence;]
[(B)] (b)(A) Prior to 1970 and is not operated for the purposes of unlawful gambling; and
[(C)] (B) Has permanently affixed to it by the manufacturer, the manufacturer's name and either
the date of manufacture or the serial number.
SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 167.147 by section 1 of this 2009 Act apply to con-
duct occurring on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
