# A-Engrossed House Bill 2498

Ordered by the Senate May 26 Including Senate Amendments dated May 26

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Port of Portland)

#### **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Creates crime of endangering aircraft in the second degree. Punishes by maximum of one year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

Expands Port of Portland's regulatory and policing authority to port properties owned, operated, maintained or controlled by port.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to aviation safety; amending ORS 131.602, 153.005, 164.885, 778.260 and 801.395; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - **SECTION 1.** ORS 164.885 is amended to read:
- 6 164.885. (1) A person commits the crime of endangering aircraft **in the first degree** if the person knowingly:
  - (a) Throws an object at, or drops an object upon, an aircraft;
  - (b) Discharges a bow and arrow, gun, airgun or firearm at or toward an aircraft;
  - (c) Tampers with [any] an aircraft or [aircraft equipment, fuel, lubricant or parts] a part, system, machine or substance used to operate an aircraft in such a manner [such] as to impair the safety, efficiency or operation of [the] an aircraft[, unless the person does so with] without the consent of the owner, operator or possessor of the aircraft; or
  - (d) Places, sets, arms or causes to be discharged [any] **a** spring gun, trap, explosive device or explosive material with the intent of damaging, destroying or discouraging the operation of [any] **an** aircraft.
  - (2)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a person commits the crime of endangering aircraft in the second degree if the person knowingly possesses a firearm or deadly weapon in a restricted access area of a commercial service airport that has at least 2 million passenger boardings per calendar year.
  - (b) Paragraph (a) of this subsection does not apply to a person authorized under federal law or an airport security program to possess a firearm or deadly weapon in a restricted access area.
    - [(2)] (3)(a) Endangering aircraft in the first degree is a Class C felony.
    - (b) Endangering aircraft in the second degree is a Class A misdemeanor.
    - (4) As used in this section, "restricted access area" means an area of a commercial ser-

- (a) Designated as restricted in the airport security program approved by the federal Transportation Security Administration; and
- (b) Marked at points of entry with signs giving notice that access to the area is restricted.

#### **SECTION 2.** ORS 778.260 is amended to read:

- 778.260. (1) The board of the Port of Portland in accordance with ORS 198.510 to 198.600 may by ordinance [make, modify or abolish] adopt, amend or repeal regulations as convenient or necessary to provide for policing or regulating the use of [airports,] properties owned, operated, maintained or controlled by the port and of [any] facilities located at or in conjunction with [airports, owned, operated, maintained or controlled by the port] these properties.
- (2) The port may appoint peace officers who [shall have the same authority as other peace officers, for the enforcement of port, city and county ordinances and state laws at airports owned, operated, maintained or controlled by the port] have all the powers and authority given by statute to peace officers of this state.
- (3) This section does not limit the authority of a state, county or municipal peace officer to enforce state laws and city and county ordinances at [airports] properties owned, operated, maintained or controlled by the port and at facilities located at or in conjunction with these properties.
