## House Bill 2526

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits person of any age from operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device for purpose of receiving or transmitting text communication. Provides exceptions. Punishes by maximum fine of \$360.

[and the person holds:] 13 [(a) A provisional driver license issued under ORS 807.065;] [(b) A special student driver permit issued under ORS 807.230; or] 14 [(c) An instruction driver permit issued under ORS 807.280.] 15 [(2) For purposes of this section, "mobile communication device" means a text messaging device or 16 a wireless, two-way communication device designed to receive and transmit voice or text 17 18 communication.] (3) This section does not apply to a person: 19 20 (a) [To a person] Who is summoning medical or other emergency help if no other person in the vehicle is capable of summoning help; [or] 21 22(b) [To a person] Using a mobile communication device for the purpose of farming or agricultural 23operations[.]; or 24 (c) Operating an ambulance or emergency vehicle. [(4) Notwithstanding ORS 810.410, a police officer may enforce this provision only as a secondary 25action when a driver of a motor vehicle has been detained for a suspected traffic violation or some other 26 27offense.] [(5)] (4) The offense described in this section, operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile 28 29 communication device, is a Class [D] **B** traffic violation.
