# House Bill 2555

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Defines "individual with a disability" for products of individuals with disabilities as individual who receives Social Security disability benefits or Social Security income. Provides that provisions of procurement law relating to products of individuals with disabilities apply only to certain public agencies.

Directs Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries to determine suitability and prices of products of individuals with disabilities for procurement by public agencies. Requires commissioner to issue notice of determination of suitability and price to interested parties and to establish procedure for protest of commissioner's determination.

Establishes Commission for the Products of Individuals with Disabilities. Provides that actions of Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries with respect to procurement law for products of individuals with disabilities are subject to policies of commission.

Becomes operative January 1, 2010.

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Declares emergency, effective on passage.

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to products of individuals with disabilities; creating new provisions; amending ORS 261.335,

3 279.835, 279.845, 279.850, 279.855 and 565.442; and declaring an emergency.

#### 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 279.835 is amended to read:

6 279.835. As used in ORS 279.835 to 279.855:

7 [(1) "Department" means the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.]

8 [(2)] (1)(a) "Direct labor" [*includes all*] **means** work required for preparation, processing and 9 packing[,].

(b) "Direct labor" does not include [but not] supervision, administration, inspection [and] or
 shipping.

[(3)] (2) "Individual with a disability" means an individual who, because of the nature of the individual's disabilities, is receiving federal Social Security disability benefits or income from Social Security, is not able to participate [fully] in competitive full-time or part-time employment[,] and is an individual for whom specialized employment opportunities must be provided.

(3) "Interested party" means a business that produces a product with specifications
similar to a product determined to be suitable for procurement under ORS 279.835 to 279.855
or a labor organization that has a collective bargaining agreement with the business.

20 (4)(a) "Public agency" [or "public contracting agency"] means [any] an agency of the State of 21 Oregon [or any political subdivision thereof] authorized by law to enter into public contracts [and 22 any public body created by intergovernmental agreement].

(b) "Public agency" does not include a local government or subdivision of the State of
 Oregon, a local school district, an educational service district, the Oregon University System,
 an institution of higher education identified in ORS 352.002 or a community college.

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1 (5) "Qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities" means a nonprofit activity cen-2 ter or rehabilitation facility:

3 (a) Organized under the laws of the United States or of this state and operated in the interest 4 of individuals with disabilities, [and] the net income of which does not inure in whole or in part to 5 the benefit of [any] **a** shareholder or other individual;

6 (b) That complies with [*any*] applicable occupational health and safety [*standard*] **standards** re-7 quired by the laws of the United States or of this state; and

8 (c) That in the manufacture of products and in the provision of services, whether or not the 9 products or services are procured under ORS 279.835 to 279.855, during the fiscal year **July 1 to** 10 **June 30** employs individuals with disabilities for not less than 75 percent of the work hours of direct 11 labor required **in each contract** for the manufacture or provision of the products or services.

12 **SECTION 2.** ORS 279.845 is amended to read:

13 279.845. (1) [It is the duty of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to:] The Com14 missioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, in consultation with and subject to the
15 policies set forth by the Commission for the Products of Individuals with Disabilities estab16 lished in section 6 of this 2009 Act, shall:

(a) Determine the price of [all] products manufactured and services offered for sale to [the various] public agencies by [any] a qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities. The price
shall recover for the [workshops] qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities the
cost of raw materials, labor, overhead, delivery costs and a margin held in reserve for inventory and
equipment replacement;

(b) [To] Revise [such prices] **the price** from time to time in accordance with changing cost factors; and

(c) [To] Make [such] rules regarding specifications, time of delivery and other relevant matters
of procedure [as shall be] that are necessary to carry out the purposes of ORS 279.835 to 279.855,
279A.025 (4) and 279C.335.

(2) The [department] commissioner shall establish and publish a list of sources or potential sources of products produced and services provided by [any] qualified nonprofit [agency] agencies for individuals with disabilities [and the services provided by any such agency, which the department] that the commissioner determines are suitable for procurement by public agencies pursuant to ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335. [This] The commissioner shall distribute the procurement list and revisions [thereof shall be distributed] to the procurement list to all public purchasing officers.

(3) The [department] commissioner may not delegate [any] a duty imposed under this section
 to [any] a person or public agency outside of the [department] Bureau of Labor and Industries.

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SECTION 3. ORS 279.850 is amended to read:

279.850. (1) [If any] A public agency that intends to procure [any] a product or service on the procurement list established under ORS 279.845 [, that public agency] shall, in accordance with rules of the [Oregon Department of Administrative Services] Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, procure [such] the product or service, at the price established by the [department] commissioner, from a qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities, provided the product or service is of the appropriate specifications and is available within the period required by [that] the public agency.

44 (2) In furthering the purposes of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335, it is the 45 intent of the Legislative Assembly that there be close cooperation between the [department] com-

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**missioner**, public [contracting] agencies and qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities. The [department] commissioner on behalf of public [contracting] agencies and qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities is authorized to enter into [such] contractual agreements, cooperative working relationships or other arrangements [as may be determined to be] **that are** necessary for effective coordination and efficient realization of the objectives of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335 and any other law requiring procurement of products or services.

8 **SECTION 4.** ORS 279.855 is amended to read:

9 279.855. The following may purchase equipment, materials, supplies and services [through the
10 Oregon Department of Administrative Services] from a procurement list established under ORS
11 279.845 in the same manner as state agencies do and as provided in ORS 279A.140 to 279A.155 and
12 279A.250 to 279A.290:

(1) Qualified nonprofit agencies for individuals with disabilities participating in the program set
 forth in ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279A.025 (4) and 279C.335.

(2) Residential programs when under contract with the Department of Human Services to pro vide services to youth in the custody of the state.

(3) Public benefit corporations, as defined in ORS 65.001, that provide public services either
under contract with a state agency, as defined in ORS 171.133, or under contract with a unit of local
government, as defined in ORS 190.003, that funds the contract, in whole or in part, with state funds.

20 <u>SECTION 5.</u> Sections 6 and 7 of this 2009 Act are added to and made a part of ORS 279.835 21 to 279.855.

22 <u>SECTION 6.</u> (1) There is established the Commission for the Products of Individuals with 23 Disabilities, consisting of 10 members appointed by the Governor as follows:

24 (a) Five members who represent individuals with disabilities, as defined in ORS 279.835;

25 (b) Two members who represent for-profit businesses;

26 (c) One member who represents private-sector labor organizations;

27 (d) One member who represents public-sector labor organizations; and

(e) One member who represents the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Indus tries.

(2) The appointment of a member of the commission is subject to the confirmation of the
 Senate in the manner prescribed in ORS 171.562 and 171.565.

(3) The term of office of each member is three years, but a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. Before the expiration of a member's term, the Governor shall appoint a successor whose term begins on January 1 next following. A member is eligible for reappointment. If there is a vacancy, the Governor shall make an appointment that is immediately effective for the unexpired term.

(4) The purpose of the commission is to set policy for the implementation and administration of ORS 279.835 to 279.855 and to further the policy of this state to encourage and assist individuals with disabilities who cannot participate, with reasonable accommodation, in competitive full-time or part-time employment to find useful, productive and gainful employment.

(a) Make findings and set policies for identifying and serving individuals with disabilities
who cannot participate in competitive full-time or part-time employment with reasonable
accommodation.

SECTION 7. (1) The Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries by rule shall 2627develop a procedure for an interested party to protest the commissioner's determination of the suitability or pricing of a product that appears on the procurement list described in ORS 28279.845. The procedure at a minimum shall provide a means for an interested party to peti-2930 tion for a reconsideration of the commissioner's determination and shall allow the presen-31 tation of evidence to contest the determination. (2) The commissioner shall provide an interested party with notice of the commissioner's 32determination of the suitability or pricing of a product within 30 days after the commissioner 33 34 makes the determination. The commissioner shall allow an interested party to file a protest with the commissioner within 60 days after the commissioner issues the notice required un-35 36 der this subsection. 37 SECTION 8. Notwithstanding the term of office specified in section 6 of this 2009 Act, of 38 the members first appointed to the Commission for the Products of Individuals with Disabilities: 39 40 (1) Three shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2011;

41 (2) Three shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2012; and

42 (3) Four shall serve for a term ending January 1, 2013.

44 261.335. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, people's utility dis-45 tricts are subject to the public contracting and purchasing requirements of ORS [279.835 to

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279.855,] 279C.005, 279C.100 to 279C.125 and 279C.300 to 279C.470 and ORS chapters 279A and 279B,

except ORS 279A.140 and 279A.250 to 279A.290. 2 (2) The public contracting and purchasing requirements of ORS 279.835 to 279.855, 279C.005, 3 279C.100 to 279C.125 and 279C.300 to 279C.470 and ORS chapters 279A and 279B do not apply to 4 contracts entered into by districts for the acquisition, construction, improvement or equipping of a 5 renewable energy facility or for the purchase or sale of electricity, electrical capacity or renewable 6 7 energy certificates.  <u>SECTION 12.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect
