## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Allows **certain** veterans with honorable discharges to pay tuition and fees at [Oregon resident] **discounted** rates. [Removes residency requirements for persons receiving educational benefits for veterans.] **Exempts from discounted rates distance education and self-support courses.** 

Requires certain state institutions of higher education and community colleges to participate in certain federal educational assistance programs.

Becomes operative upon adoption of certain regulations by United States Department of Defense.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to veterans' educational benefits; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 SECTION 1. (1) A state institution of higher education listed in ORS 352.002 or a com-

5 munity college shall charge an enrolled student who is not a resident of this state and who

6 is attending classes as an undergraduate on a public university or community college campus

7 in this state tuition and fees no greater than the resident rate plus 50 percent of the differ-

8 ence between the resident rate and the nonresident rate if the student served in the Armed

9 Forces of the United States and was relieved or discharged from that service under honor-10 able conditions.

(2) Every state institution of higher education listed in ORS 352.002 and community college in this state shall participate to the fullest extent allowed in the federal educational assistance programs under the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2008 (P.L. 110-252) so as to reduce the overall tuition rate for students eligible for tuition rate reduction under subsection (1) of this section to the resident tuition rate.

(3) A person who served in the Armed Forces of the United States and who receives federal tuition benefits in excess of the tuition and fees the person is charged under subsection (1) of this section at a state institution of higher education listed in ORS 352.002 or a community college where the person is enrolled shall pay tuition and fees equal to the federal tuition benefits received.

1 (4) Distance education and self-support courses as identified by each state institution of

higher education listed in ORS 352.002 and community college are exempt from the tuition
reduction provisions of this section.

4 (5) If a nonresident student otherwise eligible for tuition benefits under this section is 5 receiving federal vocational rehabilitation education benefits, that student shall pay full 6 nonresident tuition and fees charged by a state institution of higher education listed in ORS 7 352.002 or a community college.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2009 Act becomes operative upon adoption of regulations 9 by the United States Department of Defense implementing section 3317 of the Supplemental 10 Appropriations Act of 2008 (P.L. 110-252). The Chancellor of the Oregon University System 11 shall notify the Legislative Counsel upon adoption of the regulations.

12 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 13 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 14 on its passage.

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
