House Bill 2718

Sponsored by Representative GELSER, Senator JOHNSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care. Directs task force to study health care needs of women veterans. Sunsets on convening of next regular biennial legislative session.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to women veterans' health care needs; and declaring an emergency.

- **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**
- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care, con-
- 5 sisting of five members appointed as follows:
- 6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the 7 Senate.
- (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among
 members of the House of Representatives.
- 10 (c) The Director of Veterans' Affairs shall appoint one representative from the Depart-11 ment of Veterans' Affairs.
- (d) The Director of Human Services shall appoint one representative from the Depart ment of Human Services.
- 14 (e) The Adjutant General shall appoint one representative from the reintegration team
- 15 within the Oregon Military Department.
- 16 (2) The task force shall:
- 17 (a) Study the health care needs of women veterans, including but not limited to:
- 18 (A) Mental health;
- 19 (B) In-patient treatment availability;

20 (C) Appropriate women veterans' health care within this state and the federal health care

21 system; and

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- 22 (D) Identification and treatment of military sexual trauma; and
- (b) Identify other needs and establish recommendations to address those needs in women
 veterans' health care.
- 25 (3) The task force shall consult with federal, state, county and local entities, including 26 but not limited to:
- 27 (a) The Oregon Congressional Delegation;
- 28 (b) The Veterans Benefits Administration;
- 29 (c) The Veterans Health Administration;
- 30 (d) The Association of Oregon Counties;

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(e) The Oregon Medical Association; 1 2 (f) The Oregon Nurses Association; (g) An association of county veteran service officers; 3 (h) League of Oregon Cities; and 4 (i) Regional councils of government. 5 (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 6 of business. 7 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 8 9 of the task force. (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 10 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-11 12ment to become immediately effective. (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 13 or of a majority of the members of the task force. 14 15(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. (10) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor no 16 later than October 1, 2010. 17 18 (11) The Oregon Military Department, the Department of Veterans' Affairs and the Department of Human Services shall provide staff support to the task force. 19 (12) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the 20Legislative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volun-2122teers on the task force. Other members of the task force are not entitled to compensation 23or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force. (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 24 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 25to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 2627consider necessary to perform their duties. SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next 28regular biennial legislative session. 2930 SECTION 3.
