House Bill 2836

Sponsored by Representative SCHAUFLER (at the request of Jan Esler-Rowe)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows cigar bar to hold full on-premises sales license for alcoholic beverages without serving meals.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to alcoholic beverage licenses for cigar bars.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 471.

5 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) As used in this section, "cigar bar" has the meaning given that term in 6 ORS 433.835.

7 (2) Notwithstanding ORS 471.001 and 471.175, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission may issue a full on-premises sales license to a cigar bar regardless of whether the cigar bar 8 9 serves meals. However, if a cigar bar holding a full on-premises sales license does not serve meals, the commission may require the cigar bar to take precautions as prescribed by the 10 commission to prevent an individual from consuming more than three drinks containing al-11 12 coholic beverages at the cigar bar during any six-hour period. A cigar bar must comply with 13meal service requirements of the commission unless the cigar bar has provided the commission with written notice that the cigar bar does not wish to serve meals and has complied 14 with any precautions prescribed by the commission as described in this section. 1516
