

House Bill 2836

Sponsored by Representative SCHAUFLEER (at the request of Jan Esler-Rowe)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows cigar bar to hold full on-premises sales license for alcoholic beverages without serving meals.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to alcoholic beverage licenses for cigar bars.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 471.**

5 **SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, "cigar bar" has the meaning given that term in**
6 **ORS 433.835.**

7 **(2) Notwithstanding ORS 471.001 and 471.175, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission may**
8 **issue a full on-premises sales license to a cigar bar regardless of whether the cigar bar**
9 **serves meals. However, if a cigar bar holding a full on-premises sales license does not serve**
10 **meals, the commission may require the cigar bar to take precautions as prescribed by the**
11 **commission to prevent an individual from consuming more than three drinks containing al-**
12 **coholic beverages at the cigar bar during any six-hour period. A cigar bar must comply with**
13 **meal service requirements of the commission unless the cigar bar has provided the com-**
14 **mission with written notice that the cigar bar does not wish to serve meals and has complied**
15 **with any precautions prescribed by the commission as described in this section.**
