House Bill 2861

Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Oregon Small Woodlands Association)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Makes State Forestry Department technical assistance to governmental units, organizations and groups interested in planting trees optional. Provides that recipient of department technical assistance and resources must pay cost of designing, developing and implementing local program, plan or activity. Requires State Forester to annually calculate cost of technical assistance and resources provided by department and charge recipient of assistance and resources.

Requires department to charge for services provided by department under urban and community forestry program and for program workshops and conferences. Requires department to charge for program publications and materials prepared by department. Creates exception.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to charges imposed by the State Forestry Department; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 526.510 and 526.515.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 526.510 is amended to read:

526.510. (1) The State Forestry Department [shall] **may** provide technical assistance to cities, counties, other governmental units, nonprofit and civic organizations and other groups interested in planting and caring for trees in communities. Technical assistance may include, but [is not] **need not be** limited to, the following areas:

- (a) Establishing and maintaining local urban and community forestry programs;
- (b) Developing local tree management ordinances;
- (c) Developing public information programs to promote awareness of the values and benefits of the urban forest as a resource of the urban community;
 - (d) Implementing appropriate tree management and care practices;
- (e) Performing street tree inventories; and
 - (f) Planning and coordinating local tree planting projects.
- (2) The department [shall make the fullest use of] may use cooperative agreements, projects and resource sharing with local grassroots organizations, community action groups, businesses, local and state agencies, federal agencies, public and private schools, colleges and universities in designing, developing and implementing local programs, plans and activities. However, the organizations, groups, businesses, agencies, schools, colleges and universities must pay any costs of designing, developing and implementing the programs, plans and activities.
- (3) The State Forester shall annually determine the cost of technical assistance and resources provided by the department under this section and charge each governmental unit, organization or group for the technical assistance and resources that the department provided to that governmental unit, organization or group.
- **SECTION 2.** ORS 526.515 is amended to read:
- 28 526.515. (1) The State Forestry Department may receive and disburse such gifts, grants, be-

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(2) All revenues received under subsection (1) of this section and any interest earned on all cash balances except federal moneys shall be credited to the State Forestry Department Account and may be expended only for urban and community forestry purposes.

SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 526.510 and 526.515 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2009 Act apply for technical assistance, resources, services, workshops, conferences, publications and materials that the State Forestry Department provides on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
