## House Bill 2880

Sponsored by Representative BAILEY

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## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates Jobs Creation Strategies Commission. Appropriates moneys to Legislative Administration Committee for purposes of commission.

Sunsets on date of convening of next regular biennial legislative session.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- 2 Relating to the Jobs Creation Strategies Commission; appropriating money; and declaring an emer-3 gency.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Jobs Creation Strategies Commission is created, consisting of six 6 members appointed as follows:
  - (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among the members of the Senate. One member shall be a member of the Democratic Party and one member shall be a member of the Republican Party.
  - (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among the members of the House of Representatives. One member shall be a member of the Democratic Party and one member shall be a member of the Republican Party.
    - (c) The Governor shall appoint two members.
    - (2) The commission shall:
  - (a) Evaluate the amount of state funding given to businesses during the preceding decade;
  - (b) Identify those businesses receiving money from the state that are locally owned businesses;
  - (c) Identify the amount of state funding described in paragraph (a) of this subsection that was received by locally owned businesses;
  - (d) Identify the quantity and types of jobs created by locally owned businesses as a result of the funding described in paragraph (c) of this subsection; and
  - (e) Make recommendations on how the information described in paragraphs (a) to (d) of this subsection can continue to be gathered in future biennia and publicly disseminated.
    - (3) The commission shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
  - (4) The commission shall meet at such times and places as specified by the call of the chairperson or a majority of the members of the commission.
    - (5) The commission may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the commission.
  - (6) The commission may consult with and may receive testimony from persons knowledgeable in and representing diverse viewpoints on economic development and jobs creation.

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

- (7) The commission shall submit a report containing the results of its evaluations and its recommendations, which may include recommendations for legislation, to interim committees of the Legislative Assembly having jurisdiction over matters of economic development no later than October 1, 2010.
  - (8) The Legislative Administrator shall provide staff support to the commission.
- (9) Members of the commission who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the commission.
- (10) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the commission in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the commission consider necessary to perform their duties.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next regular biennial legislative session.
- <u>SECTION 3.</u> There is appropriated to the Legislative Administration Committee, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ for the purpose of carrying out the duties of the Jobs Creation Strategies Commission.
- <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
