SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires Department of Transportation to study Oregon Route 126 between Veneta and Eugene. Appropriates moneys from General Fund to department for purpose of study. Requires department to seek reimbursement from federal funds for amount appropriated from General Fund. Sunsets January 2, 2012.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2	Relating to a study by the Department of Transportation; appropriating money; and declaring an
3	emergency.
4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Transportation shall undertake a study to examine
6	the existing and projected future conditions of Oregon Route 126 between the cities of Veneta
7	and Eugene. The purpose of the study is to identify:
8	(a) Alternatives to increasing capacity on Oregon Route 126; and
9	(b) Specific improvements to meet the needs of the traveling public.
10	(2) The department shall report the results of the study to the Seventy-sixth Legislative
11	Assembly.
12	SECTION 2. There is appropriated to the Department of Transportation, for the biennium
13	beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$ for the purpose of
14	carrying out the study described in section 1 of this 2009 Act.
15	SECTION 3. (1) The Director of Transportation shall seek reimbursement of the amount
16	appropriated under section 2 of this 2009 Act from federal funds.
17	(2) The director shall deposit amounts reimbursed under this section into the General
18	Fund.
19	SECTION 4. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on January 2, 2012.
20	SECTION 5. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
21	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect
22	on its passage.
