

# House Bill 2965

Sponsored by Representative READ

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Task Force on Transfer of Technology.  
Sunsets task force on date of convening of next regular biennial legislative session.  
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to the transfer of technology; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) There is created the Task Force on Transfer of Technology, consisting**  
5 **of nine members appointed as follows:**

6 (a) **The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the**  
7 **Senate.**

8 (b) **The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among**  
9 **members of the House of Representatives.**

10 (c) **The Governor shall appoint five members.**

11 (2) **The task force shall examine ways to improve the transfer of technology in Oregon.**

12 (3) **A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction**  
13 **of business.**

14 (4) **Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members**  
15 **of the task force.**

16 (5) **The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.**

17 (6) **If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-**  
18 **ment to become immediately effective.**

19 (7) **The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson**  
20 **or of a majority of the members of the task force.**

21 (8) **The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.**

22 (9) **The task force may pre-session file legislation in the manner provided in ORS 171.130**  
23 **for interim committees. All legislation recommended by official action of the task force must**  
24 **indicate that it is introduced at the request of the task force.**

25 (10) **The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in**  
26 **ORS 192.245 at any time within 30 days after its final meeting or at such later time as the**  
27 **President and Speaker may designate.**

28 (11) **The Legislative Administrator may employ persons necessary for the performance**  
29 **of the functions of the task force. The Legislative Administrator shall fix the duties and**  
30 **amounts of compensation of these employees. The task force shall use the services of per-**  
31 **manent legislative staff to the greatest extent practicable.**

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted.  
New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1       **(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist**  
2 **the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating**  
3 **to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force**  
4 **consider necessary to perform their duties.**

5       **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next**  
6 **regular biennial legislative session.**

7       **SECTION 3. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
8 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect**  
9 **on its passage.**

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
