House Bill 3028

Sponsored by Representative HUNT (at the request of Susan and Eric Shawn)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Permits person to operate low-speed vehicle on highway with speed limit of 45 miles per hour or less. Provides for cities and counties to adopt exceptions.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to low-speed vehicles; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 811.512.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 811.512 is amended to read:
 - 811.512. (1) A person commits the offense of unlawfully operating a low-speed vehicle on a highway if the person operates a low-speed vehicle on a highway that has a speed limit or posted speed of more than [35] **45** miles per hour.
 - (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, a city or county may adopt an ordinance allowing operation of low-speed vehicles on city streets or county roads that have speed limits or posted speeds of more than [35] **45** miles per hour.
 - (3) The offense described in this section, unlawfully operating a low-speed vehicle on a highway, is a Class B traffic violation.
 - SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 811.512 by section 1 of this 2009 Act apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
