SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife to develop plan for reforming hatchery operations and reconstructing hatchery facilities.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to fish hatcheries; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Department of Fish and Wildlife shall develop a plan to reform 5 operation of department-operated fish hatcheries on the Oregon coast.

6 (2) The plan shall include provisions for:

- 7 (a) Evaluation and prioritization of deferred maintenance at fish hatcheries;
- 8 (b) Reduction of chemical effluent and fish waste outfall at hatcheries that may be af-

9 fecting native and wild fish;

- 10 (c) Reduction of disease outbreaks in hatchery-raised salmon, steelhead and trout; and
- 11 (d) Consolidation of hatchery production.
- (3) The department shall also plan for reconstruction of department-operated coastal
 hatcheries that will allow for:
- 14 (a) Raising multiple groups of fish simultaneously;
- 15 (b) Sorting and holding returning adults of multiple broodstocks simultaneously;
- 16 (c) Reducing density of fish in hatchery facilities; and
- 17 (d) Reducing the holding mortality of wild capture broodstock.
- 18 (4) The department shall complete the plan and submit it to an interim committee related
- 19 to environment and natural resources for review on or before October 1, 2010.

20 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 21 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect

- 22 on its passage.
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
