# House Bill 3143

Sponsored by Representatives KAHL, SHIELDS; Representative KOTEK, Senator CARTER

### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires person who bids for public improvement contract to demonstrate responsibility by showing that person has record of meeting or exceeding standards for workforce diversity on previous contracts.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to determinations of responsibility for contractors; creating new provisions; amending ORS

3 279C.375; and declaring an emergency.

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 279C.375 is amended to read:

6 279C.375. (1) After [bids are opened and a determination is made that] a contracting agency has

opened bids and determined that the contracting agency will award a public improvement contract [is to be awarded], the contracting agency shall award the contract to the lowest responsible
bidder.

10 (2) At least seven days before [*the award of*] **awarding** a public improvement contract, unless 11 the contracting agency determines that seven days is impractical under rules adopted under ORS 12 279A.065, the contracting agency shall issue to each bidder or post, electronically or otherwise, a 13 notice of the contracting agency's intent to award a contract. This subsection does not apply to a 14 contract [*excepted or exempted from*] **to which** competitive bidding **does not apply** under ORS 15 279C.335 (1)(c) or (d). The notice and [*its*] **the** manner [*of posting or issuance*] **in which the notice** 16 **is posted or issued** must conform to rules adopted under ORS 279A.065.

17 (3) In determining the lowest responsible bidder, a contracting agency shall do all of the fol-18 lowing:

(a) Check the list created by the Construction Contractors Board under ORS 701.227 for bidders
 who are not qualified to hold a public improvement contract.

(b) Determine whether the bidder [*has met the standards of responsibility*. In making the determination, the contracting agency shall consider whether a bidder has:] is responsible. To be a responsible bidder, a bidder must demonstrate to the contracting agency that the bidder:

(A) Has available the appropriate financial, material, equipment, facility and personnel re sources and expertise, or has the ability to obtain the resources and expertise, necessary to meet
 all contractual responsibilities.

(B) **Has** a satisfactory record of performance. The contracting agency shall document the **bid**der's record of performance [of a bidder] if the contracting agency finds under this subparagraph

that the bidder is not [to be] responsible [under this subparagraph].

30 (C) Has a satisfactory record of integrity. The contracting agency shall document the bidder's

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1	record of integrity [of a bidder] if the contracting agency finds under this subparagraph that the
2	bidder is not [to be] responsible [under this subparagraph].
3	(D) Has a record of completing previous public contracts, or other contracts if the bidder
4	has not previously bid for a public contract, in which the bidder:
5	(i) Met or exceeded workforce diversity goals specified in the contract or in policies the
6	contracting agency or other contracting party adopted, including workforce diversity goals
7	intended to increase the number of women and minorities in the workforce and workforce
8	diversity goals intended to increase the availability of apprenticeships in the bidder's trade
9	or industry;
10	(ii) Qualified as a responsible bidder under the provisions of ORS 200.045 and made good
11	faith efforts to satisfy the subcontracting requirement for emerging small business enter-
12	prises as described in ORS 200.045; and
13	(iii) Did not violate the provisions of ORS 279A.110.
14	[(D)] (E) Is legally qualified [legally] to contract with the contracting agency.
15	[(E)] (F) Has supplied all necessary information in connection with the inquiry concerning re-
16	sponsibility. If a bidder fails to promptly supply information concerning responsibility that [re-
17	quested by] the contracting agency [concerning responsibility] requests, the contracting agency:
18	(i) Shall [base the determination of] determine the bidder's responsibility [upon any] based on
19	available information[,]; or
20	(ii) May find that the bidder is not [to be] responsible.
21	(c) Document the contracting agency's compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (a) and
22	(b) of this subsection in substantially the following form:

39	(d) Submit the form described in paragraph (c) of this subsection, with any attachments, to the
40	Construction Contractors Board within 30 days after the date the contracting agency awards the
41	contract.
42	(4) The successful bidder shall:
43	(a) Promptly execute a formal contract; and

(b) Execute and deliver to the contracting agency a performance bond and a payment bond whenrequired under ORS 279C.380.

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1 (5) Based on competitive bids, a contracting agency may award a public improvement contract 2 or may award multiple public improvement contracts when specified in the invitation to bid.

3 (6) A contracting agency may not exclude a commercial contractor from competing for a public 4 contract on the basis that the license issued by the Construction Contractors Board is endorsed as 5 a level 1 or level 2 license. As used in this section, "commercial contractor" has the meaning given 6 that term in ORS 701.005.

7 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2009 Act apply to 8 contracts first advertised or otherwise solicited or, if not advertised or solicited, first en-9 tered into on or after the operative date of this 2009 Act.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2009 Act become
 operative on January 1, 2010.

(2) The Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services and a contracting agency that has adopted rules under ORS 279A.065 may adopt rules and take any related actions before January 1, 2010, that are necessary to enable the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the director and the contracting agency to exercise, on and after January 1, 2010, all the duties, functions and powers conferred on the Secretary of State, the Attorney General, the director and the contracting agency by the amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2009 Act.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect
 on its passage.

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
