House Bill 3204

Sponsored by Representatives KOTEK, MAURER; Representatives CANNON, HARKER, HUFFMAN, THOMPSON, Senators FERRIOLI, KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON, MORRISETTE (at the request of Oregon Dental Hygienists Association, Oregon Rural Health Association)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Modifies qualifications for dental hygienists authorized to practice dental hygiene without license and for limited access permit dental hygienists. Revises scope of practice of limited access permit dental hygienists.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to dental hygienists; amending ORS 680.020, 680.060, 680.200 and 680.205; and declaring an 2 3 emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 SECTION 1. ORS 680.020 is amended to read:

680.020. (1) It [shall be] is unlawful for any person not otherwise authorized by law to practice 6 7 dental hygiene or purport to be a dental hygienist without a valid license to practice dental hygiene

8 issued by the Oregon Board of Dentistry.

9 (2) The requirements of this section [shall] do not apply to:

(a) Dental hygienists licensed in another state making a clinical presentation sponsored by a 10 bona fide dental or dental hygiene society or association or an accredited dental or dental hygiene 11 12 education program approved by the board.

13 (b) Bona fide [*full-time*] students of dental hygiene who[,] engage in clinical studies during the period of their enrollment and as a part of the course of study in an Oregon dental hygiene educa-14 tion program. The program must be accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the 1516 American Dental Association, or its successor agency, if any, [which must have been] and approved by the board[, engage in clinical studies]. The clinical study may be conducted on the premises 17of [such] the program or in a clinical setting located off the premises. [if] The facility, the instruc-18 19 tional staff, and the course of study at the off-premises location **must** meet minimum requirements 20 prescribed by the rules of the board, and the clinical study [is] at the off-premises location must 21**be** performed under the direct supervision of a member of the faculty.

22(c) Bona fide [full-time] students of dental hygiene who[,] engage in community-based or clinical studies as an elective or required rotation in a clinical setting located in Oregon 2324 during the period of their enrollment and as a part of the course of study in a dental hygiene education program located outside of Oregon. [that is] The program must be accredited by the Com-2526 mission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association or its successor agency.[, 27engage in community-based or clinical studies as an elective or required rotation in a clinical setting

- 28located in Oregon if] The community-based or clinical studies must:
- 29 (A) Meet minimum requirements prescribed by the rules of the board; and [are]

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1 (B) Be performed under the direct supervision of a member of the faculty of the Oregon Health 2 and Science University School of Dentistry or another Oregon [*university*] institution with an ac-3 credited dental hygiene education program approved by the board.

4 (d) Students of dental hygiene or graduates of dental hygiene programs who engage in 5 clinical studies as part of a course of study or continuing education course offered by an 6 institution with a dental or dental hygiene program. The program must be accredited by the 7 Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association or its successor 8 agency.

9 [(d)] (e) Candidates who are preparing for licensure examination to practice dental hygiene and 10 whose application has been accepted by the board or its agent, if such clinical preparation is con-11 ducted in a clinic located on premises approved for that purpose by the board and if the procedures 12 are limited to examination only.

[(e)] (f) Dental hygienists practicing in the discharge of official duties as employees of the
 United States Government and any of its agencies.

[(f)] (g) Instructors of dental hygiene, whether full- or part-time, while exclusively engaged in
 teaching activities and while employed in accredited dental hygiene educational programs.

[(g)] (h) Dental hygienists employed by public health agencies who are not engaged in direct
 delivery of clinical dental hygiene services to patients.

[(h)] (i) Counselors and health assistants who have been trained in the application of fluoride
varnishes to the teeth of children and who apply fluoride varnishes only to the teeth of children
enrolled in or receiving services from the Women, Infants and Children Program, the Oregon
prekindergarten program or a federal Head Start grant program.

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SECTION 2. ORS 680.060 is amended to read:

24 680.060. (1) The Oregon Board of Dentistry may administer written, laboratory or clinical ex-25 aminations to test professional knowledge and skills.

(2) The examination shall be sufficiently thorough to test the fitness of the applicant to practice
dental hygiene. It shall include, written in the English language, questions on any subjects pertaining to dental hygiene. The written examination may be supplemented by oral examination. Demonstrations of the applicant's skill in clinical dental hygiene also may be required.

(3) The board may accept the results of national standardized examinations in satisfaction of the
 written examination as authorized by this section, and shall accept the results of regional testing
 agencies or of clinical board examinations administered by other states in satisfaction of the clinical
 examination authorized under this section, provided:

34 (a) The test or examination was taken within five years of the date of application; and

(b) The applicant received a passing score on the test or examination as established by theboard by rule.

(4) The board shall accept the results of regional testing agencies or of clinical board examinations administered by other states in satisfaction of the examinations authorized under this section for applicants who meet all requirements for licensure other than satisfaction of examination requirements and who have engaged in the active practice of dental hygiene for a period of at least 3,500 hours in the five years immediately preceding application in:

42 (a) **Oregon**;

43 (**b**) [In] Other states; [or]

44 (c) [In] The Armed Forces of the United States[,];

45 (d) The United States Public Health Service; or

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(e) The United States Department of Veterans Affairs [for a period of at least 3,500 hours in the 1 2 five years immediately preceding application and who meet all other requirements for licensure]. 3 SECTION 3. ORS 680.200 is amended to read:

680.200. (1) Upon application accompanied by the fee established by the Oregon Board of 4 Dentistry, the board shall grant a permit to practice as a limited access permit dental hygienist to 5 any applicant who: 6

(a) Holds a valid, unrestricted Oregon dental hygiene license; 7

(b)(A) Has a baccalaureate degree in dental hygiene; or 8

9 (B) If the applicant does not have a baccalaureate degree in dental hygiene, presents evi-

dence satisfactory to the board of at least [2,500] 500 hours of supervised dental hygiene practice; 10

11 (c) Presents proof of current professional liability insurance coverage; and

12[(d) Presents documentation satisfactory to the board of successful completion of a total of 40 hours

13 of course content from a formal, post-secondary educational program accredited by the Commission on

Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association or its successor agency or other appropriate 14

15 health professional program accreditation agency and approved by the board, including but not limited 16 to:]

[(A) General medicine and physical diagnosis;] 17

18 [(B) Pharmacology;]

[(C) Oral pathology;] 19

[(D) Patient management and psychology; and] 20

[(E) Jurisprudence relating to unsupervised practice with limited access patients; and] 21

22[(e)] (d) Presents documentation satisfactory to the board of successful completion of an emergency life support course for health professionals, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, from an 23agency or educational institution approved by the board. 24

(2) All permits issued pursuant to subsection (1) of this section expire two years following the 25date of issuance unless renewed on or before that date by: 26

27(a) Payment of the renewal fee as set by the board;

(b) Submission to the board of satisfactory evidence of completion of at least 36 hours of con-28tinuing education, 12 hours of which shall be in the course content areas required in subsection (1) 2930 of this section]; and

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(c) Presentation to the board of proof of professional liability insurance coverage.

(3) The board may refuse to issue or renew a limited access permit or may suspend or revoke 32the permit of a limited access permit dental hygienist who has been convicted of an offense or been 33 34 disciplined by a dental licensing body in a manner that bears, in the judgment of the board, a demonstrable relationship to the ability of the applicant to practice limited access permit dental hy-35 giene in accordance with the provisions of this chapter or ORS chapter 679, or who has falsified an 36 37 application for permit, or any person for any cause described under ORS 679.140 or 679.170.

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SECTION 4. ORS 680.205 is amended to read:

680.205. (1) A dental hygienist issued a permit to act as a limited access permit dental hygienist 39 under ORS 680.200 shall be authorized to render all services within the scope of practice of dental 40 hygiene, as defined in ORS 679.010, without the supervision of a dentist and as authorized by the 41 limited access permit to: 42

(a) Patients or residents of the following facilities or programs who, due to age, infirmity or 43 disability, are unable to receive regular dental hygiene treatment: 44

(A) Nursing homes as defined in ORS 678.710; 45

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(B) Adult foster homes as defined in ORS 443.705;

2 (C) Residential care facilities as defined in ORS 443.400; (D) Adult congregate living facilities as defined in ORS 441.525; 3 (E) Mental health residential programs administered by the Department of Human Services; 4 (F) Facilities for mentally ill persons, as those terms are defined in ORS 426.005; 5 (G) Facilities for persons with mental retardation, as those terms are defined in ORS 427.005; 6 (H) Local correctional facilities and juvenile detention facilities as those terms are defined in 7 ORS 169.005, regional correctional facilities as defined in ORS 169.620, youth correction facilities 8 9 as defined in ORS 420.005, youth care centers as defined in ORS 420.855, and Department of Corrections institutions as defined in ORS 421.005; or 10 (I) Public and nonprofit community health clinics. 11 12(b) Adults who are homebound. 13 (c) Students or enrollees of nursery schools and day care programs and their siblings under 18 years of age, Job Corps and other similar employment training facilities, primary and secondary 14

schools, including private schools and public charter schools, and persons entitled to benefits under
the Women, Infants and Children Program.

(d) Patients in hospitals, medical clinics, medical offices or offices operated or staffed by
 nurse practitioners, physician assistants or midwives.

(2) The Oregon Board of Dentistry may authorize the provision of dental hygiene services by a
 limited access permit dental hygienist at locations or to populations that are underserved or lack
 access to dental hygiene services.

(3) At least once each calendar year, a dental hygienist issued a permit to act as a limited access permit dental hygienist shall refer each patient or resident to a dentist who is available to treat
the patient or resident.

[(4) This section does not authorize a limited access permit dental hygienist to administer local anesthesia, denture soft lines, temporary restorations and radiographs except under the general supervision of a dentist licensed under ORS chapter 679, or to administer nitrous oxide except under the indirect supervision of a dentist licensed under ORS chapter 679.]

[(5)] (4) A limited access permit dental hygienist may assess the need for and appropriateness of sealants, apply sealants and write prescriptions for all applications of fluoride in which fluoride is applied or supplied to patients.

(5) A limited access permit dental hygienist may provide temporary therapeutic restora tions to patients.

(6) A person granted a limited access permit under ORS 680.200 shall also procure all other
 permits or certificates required by the board under ORS 679.250.

36 <u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 37 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 38 on its passage.

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
