# House Bill 3254

Sponsored by Representative JENSON (at the request of Dennis Doherty, Michael Roxbury)

### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows radio and data districts to be formed as special districts. Authorizes districts to acquire and operate radio and data communication equipment, facilities and real property related to radio and data communication for emergency communications purposes. Authorizes districts to submit property tax and bond measures to district electors for approval or rejection. Authorizes districts to contract with United States for acquisition and operation of radio and data communication facilities and related property.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

2	Relating to special districts; creating new provisions; amending ORS 174.116, 198.010, 198.310,
3	198.510 and 255.012; and prescribing an effective date.
4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. Definitions. As used in sections 1 to 18 of this 2009 Act:
6	(1) "County" means the county in which all or a portion of the district is located.
7	(2) "County board" means county court or board of county commissioners of the county.
8	(3) "District" means a radio and data district formed under sections 1 to 18 of this 2009
9	Act.
10	(4) "District board" means the governing body of a district.
11	SECTION 2. Application of election laws. (1) ORS chapter 255 governs the following:
12	(a) The nomination and election of the members of the district board of a radio and data
13	district.
14	(b) The conduct of all elections in the district.
15	(2) The electors of a district may exercise the powers of the initiative and referendum
16	regarding a district measure, in accordance with ORS 255.135 to 255.205.
17	SECTION 3. Formation. (1) Ten or more residents of a county may petition the county
18	board, or a county board by its own resolution may resolve, for the formation of a radio and
19	data district within all or a portion of the county.
20	(2) In the case of two or more contiguous counties, 10 or more residents of the contig-
21	uous area may petition the county boards of all counties within the contiguous area for the
22	formation of a district or the county boards of all counties within the contiguous area may
23	adopt the same resolution for the formation of a district within the contiguous area.
24	(3) In addition to other required matters, a petition or resolution for formation shall
25	state the number of members to be on the district board and the method of election of the
26	board of the proposed district from among the methods described in section 5 of this 2009
27	Act.
28	(4) The petition or resolution shall include a description of the proposed district, includ-

ing district boundaries. If all or a portion of the members of a district board are to be elected 1 by zone, the petition or resolution shall include a description of zone boundaries. If zones are 2 proposed to be established within the district, the zones proposed to be established shall 3 comply with section 9 of this 2009 Act. 4 SECTION 4. Size of district board; qualifications. (1) The governing body of a radio and  $\mathbf{5}$ data district shall be a board of three or five members, to be elected by the electors of the 6 district, and an administrator, to be appointed by the district board. 7 (2) Every elector of a district is qualified to be a member of the district board. 8 9 SECTION 5. Size of district board at formation; terms of office. (1) The number of district board members to be elected in a radio and data district shall be three or five, according 10 to the number set forth in the petition or resolution for formation. The terms of the first 11 12 district board members shall be determined as provided in subsections (2) and (3) of this section. 13 (2) If a three-member district board is to be elected: 14 15 (a) The candidates receiving the highest and the second highest vote shall be elected to a term expiring June 30 next following the second regular district election. 16 (b) The candidate receiving the third highest vote shall be elected to a term expiring June 1718 30 next following the first regular district election. (3) If a five-member district board is to be elected: 19 (a) The candidates receiving the first, second and third highest vote shall be elected to 20a term expiring June 30 next following the second regular district election. 2122(b) The candidates receiving the fourth and fifth highest vote shall be elected to a term expiring June 30 next following the first regular district election. 23SECTION 6. Election of district board after formation; terms. (1) At the regular district 24election of a radio and data district, successors to the district board members whose terms 25expire shall be elected as follows: 2627(a) In an unzoned district, if one board member is to be elected, the candidate receiving the highest vote shall be elected. If two or three board members are to be elected, the can-28didates receiving the first and second or first, second and third highest vote shall be elected. 2930 (b) In a district that is zoned under section 9 of this 2009 Act: 31 (A) If a board member is to be elected by the electors of a zone, the candidate who receives the highest vote from the zone shall be elected. 32(B) If a board member is to be elected by the electors of the entire district, the candidate 33 34 receiving the highest vote among the candidates nominated from the same zone shall be 35 elected. (2) Except as provided in section 5 of this 2009 Act, the term of a district board member 36 37 is four years. 38 SECTION 7. Oath of office. A district board member of a radio and data district shall take the oath of office within 10 days after receiving the certificate of election. 39 SECTION 8. District board as governing body; president and administrator; meetings; 40 vacancies. (1) The district board of a radio and data district shall be the governing body of 41 the district and shall exercise all powers of the district. 42(2) At its first meeting or as soon thereafter as may be practicable, the district board 43 shall choose one of its members as president and shall appoint an administrator who need 44 not be a member of the board. In case of the absence, or inability to act, of the president 45

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or administrator, the district board shall, by order entered upon the minutes, choose a 1 2 president pro tempore, or administrator pro tempore, or both, as the case may be. (3) All contracts, deeds, warrants, releases, receipts and documents of every kind shall 3 be signed in the name of the district by the district president and shall be countersigned by 4 the district administrator. 5 (4) The district board shall hold such meetings, either in the day or evening, as may be 6 7 necessary. (5) The district board shall fill any vacancy on the board as provided in ORS 198.320. 8 9 SECTION 9. Methods of election. (1) The district board members of a radio and data district may be elected by one of the following methods or a combination thereof: 10 (a) Elected by the electors of zones that are as nearly equal in population as possible 11 12according to the latest federal census. 13 (b) Elected at large by position number by the electors of the district. (2) Candidates for election from zones shall be nominated by the electors of the zones. 14 15 Candidates for election at large may be nominated by the electors of zones or by the electors 16 of the district, as determined under subsection (3) of this section. (3) Where the method selected under subsection (2) of this section includes a combination 1718 of nomination of candidates from zones and nomination of candidates at large, the number 19 of candidates to be nominated in each manner shall be specified in the petition or resolution 20 for formation of the district described in section 3 of this 2009 Act. SECTION 10. Boundaries of zones for district board members; adjustment for population 2122and district boundary changes. (1) The district board of a radio and data district shall adjust 23zones established within a district as necessary to make them as nearly equal in population as is feasible according to the latest federal census. The district board also shall adjust 24 25boundaries of zones as necessary to reflect boundary changes of the district.

(2) For purposes of ad valorem property taxation, a district change must be filed in final
 approved form with the county assessor and the Department of Revenue as provided in ORS
 308.225.

29 <u>SECTION 11.</u> General district powers. Every radio and data district shall have power:

30 (1) To have and use a common seal.

31 (2) To sue and be sued in the name of the district.

(3) To construct, reconstruct, acquire, maintain, upgrade and operate radio and data
 communication facilities and equipment, including land, buildings, improvements and other
 property needed to maintain two-way radio and data emergency communications within the
 district and to connect with other emergency communications facilities and networks within
 and outside of the district.

(4) To acquire by lease, purchase, gift, devise, condemnation proceedings or otherwise
such real and personal property and rights of way, either within or without the limits of the
district as, in the judgment of the district board, are necessary or proper to fulfill the purposes of the district, and to pay for and hold the same.

(5) To make and accept any and all contracts, deeds, leases, releases and documents of
any kind that, in the judgment of the district board, are necessary or proper to the exercise
of any power of the district, and to direct the payment of all lawful claims or demands.

(6) To assess, levy and collect taxes to pay the cost of acquiring sites for and construct ing, reconstructing, altering, operating and maintaining any property, equipment or facilities

that may be acquired, or any lawful claims or demands against the district, and the operating 1

2 expenses of the district.

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(7) To employ all necessary agents and employees.

(8) To make and enforce rules and regulations for the proper operations of the district. 4

(9) To prohibit any person that violates any rule or regulation from thereafter using the 5 facilities of the district for such period as the district board may determine. 6

(10) To call necessary or proper district elections after the formation of the district.

(11) To enlarge the boundaries of the district as provided by ORS 198.705 to 198.955.

9 (12) To establish and collect reasonable fees and charges to support district operations and the maintenance and operation of district property, facilities and equipment. 10

(13) Generally to do and perform any and all acts necessary and proper to the complete 11 12exercise and effect of any of the district's powers or the purposes for which the district was formed. 13

SECTION 12. Levy of taxes. (1) At the time of formation or, after formation, through 14 15 determination of the district board of a radio and data district, the district may establish a 16 permanent rate limitation on ad valorem property taxes as prescribed in ORS 280.070.

(2) A district board may elect to impose a local option tax under ORS 280.040 to 280.145 17in lieu of a permanent rate limitation. 18

19 (3) Upon receiving authority from district electors to levy ad valorem property taxes, the district board shall for each fiscal year determine and establish the rate or amount of ad 20valorem property taxes to be levied by the district within any applicable tax limitation. 21

22SECTION 13. Deposit and disbursement of district moneys. (1) Except as otherwise pro-23vided in sections 1 to 18 of this 2009 Act, the moneys of a radio and data district shall be deposited, in the discretion of the district board, either with the county treasurer of the 24 county, in accordance with subsections (2) to (4) of this section, or in one or more banks or 25savings and loan associations to be designated by the board. Funds deposited in a bank or 2627savings and loan association shall be withdrawn or paid out only upon proper order and warrant or check signed by the district administrator and countersigned by the president of 28the district board. The district board may by resolution designate other persons who may 2930 sign warrants or checks on behalf of the president or administrator.

31 (2) If district funds are deposited with the county treasurer, the county treasurer shall pay out moneys from the funds only upon the written order of the district board, signed by 32the president of the board and countersigned by the district administrator. The order shall 33 34 specify the name of the person to whom the moneys are to be paid and the fund from which 35 the moneys are to be paid, and shall state generally the purpose for which the payment is made. The order shall be entered in the minutes of the district board. 36

37 (3) The county treasurer shall keep the order as a voucher, and shall keep a specific ac-38 count of receipts and disbursements of moneys for the district.

SECTION 14. County counsel to aid district board. The district board of a radio and data 39 district may call upon the county counsel of the county in which the district is located for 40 advice on district business. If the district is located in more than one county, the district 41 may by intergovernmental agreement designate the county counsel of any one county as 42counsel for the district. The district board may at any time employ special counsel for any 43 44 purpose.

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SECTION 15. Power to contract bonded indebtedness. A radio and data district has the

**1** power to contract bonded indebtedness for the purpose of providing funds:

2 (1) To acquire land, rights of way and interests in land, buildings and equipment.

3 (2) To improve land and install facilities.

4 (3) To construct, reconstruct, improve, repair and furnish buildings.

5 (4) To acquire equipment of all types, including vehicular equipment necessary for and 6 in the use, development and improvement of the real property, equipment and facilities of 7 the district.

8 (5) To pay the costs, expenses and attorney fees incurred in the issue and sale of the
9 bonds.

10 (6) To fund or refund outstanding indebtedness, or for any one or combination of any
 11 such purposes.

12 <u>SECTION 16.</u> Bond elections. (1) For the purpose of providing funds with which to put 13 into effect one or any combination of the purposes authorized under section 15 of this 2009 14 Act, the district board of a radio and data district, when authorized by a majority of those 15 voting at an election called for that purpose, may borrow money and sell and dispose of 16 general obligation bonds.

17 (2) The district board:

18 (a) May order an election under this section on its own resolution; or

(b) Shall order an election under this section when a petition is filed as provided in this
 section.

(3) A petition shall specify a dollar amount for carrying out any one or more of the
purposes authorized by section 15 of this 2009 Act. The requirements for preparing, circulating and filing a petition under this section shall be as provided for an initiative petition
under ORS 255.135 to 255.205.

25 <u>SECTION 17.</u> Authority for issuance of general obligation bonds and revenue bonds; is-26 <u>suance and sale.</u> (1) Whenever authorized by the electors of the district, the district board 27 of a radio and data district may issue general obligation bonds of the district, not exceeding 28 the principal amount stated in the notice of election and for the purpose therein named.

(2) In addition to the authority to issue general obligation bonds, a district, when au-2930 thorized by a majority of those voting at an election called for that purpose, may sell and 31 dispose of revenue bonds, and pledge as security therefor all or any part of the unobligated net revenue of the district to purchase, acquire, construct, reconstruct or improve a facility, 32or to perform any of those acts in combination, for any authorized purpose. Revenue bonds 33 34 shall be issued in the same manner and form as are general obligation bonds of the district, 35 but they shall be payable, both as to principal and interest, from revenues only. Revenue bonds shall be payable solely from such part of the revenue of the district as remains after 36 37 payment of obligations having a priority and of all expenses of operation and maintenance 38 of the district, including any taxes levied against the district. All revenue bonds shall contain a clause reciting that both the principal and interest are payable solely from operating re-39 venues of the district remaining after paying such obligations and expenses. 40

(3) General obligation and revenue bonds must recite that they are issued under sections
1 to 18 of this 2009 Act. All bonds shall be signed by the president of the district board and
attested by the district administrator.

(4) All general obligation and revenue bonds issued, including refunding bonds, shall be
 issued as prescribed in ORS chapter 287A.

1 <u>SECTION 18.</u> Contracts with United States. (1) In carrying out the powers conferred by 2 sections 1 to 18 of this 2009 Act, a radio and data district may contract with the United 3 States or any agency thereof for the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, maintenance 4 and operation, or any of them, of radio and data equipment and facilities or other property 5 for use by the district.

6 (2) Contract provisions for repayment of any loan from the United States, and the bonds 7 securing the payment of the loan, if any are issued, may be of any term or denomination not 8 exceeding 50 years and may call for the payment of interest not exceeding seven percent per 9 annum, may provide for installments and for repayment of the principal at such times as 10 may be required by federal law or as may be agreed upon between the district board and the 11 United States agency.
