## House Bill 3357

Sponsored by Representatives HARKER, READ

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires public schools to meet high environmental standards for design and construction of buildings or renovations to buildings.

Establishes Healthy School Buildings Fund for purpose of providing funding to school districts to offset additional costs of meeting high environmental standards. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to State Department of Energy for distribution to school districts.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to environmental standards for educational buildings; and appropriating money.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. (1) A district school board shall ensure that all kindergarten through grade 12 public schools in the school district meet high environmental standards for the design and construction of:
    - (a) New buildings or additions to existing buildings; and
    - (b) Building renovations that have a budgeted cost that is 50 percent or more than the assessed value of the building before the renovation.
    - (2) A school may meet high environmental standards as required by subsection (1) of this section by:
    - (a) Qualifying for one of the two highest levels of standards prescribed by a national certification program that provides the benchmark for the design, construction and operation of buildings that meet high environmental standards; or
    - (b) Meeting any other established energy efficiency and environmentally sustainable construction and operation standards that are identified by the State Department of Energy by rule.
    - (3) A district school board may receive funding to offset the additional costs of meeting the standards required by this section by applying to the State Department of Energy for a loan without any interest from the Healthy School Buildings Fund created by section 2 of this 2009 Act.
    - (4) The State Department of Energy shall seek federal grant funds for the purpose of assisting school districts in complying with the requirements of this section.
    - (5) The State Department of Energy may accept contributions of funds and assistance from the United States Government and its agencies or from any other source, public or private, and agree to conditions placed on the funds not inconsistent with the provisions of this section.
    - (6) All funds received by the State Department of Energy under subsections (4) and (5) of this section shall be deposited in the Healthy School Buildings Fund created by section 2 of this 2009 Act.

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

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SECTION 2. (1) The Healthy School Buildings Fund is established in the State Treasury
separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Healthy Schoo
Buildings Fund shall be credited to the fund. All moneys in the fund are continuously ap
propriated to the State Department of Energy for distribution to school districts for the
purpose of meeting the high environmental standards for buildings as required by section 1
of this 2009 Act.

(2) All moneys received by the department from any public or private source for the purpose of ensuring that public schools meet high environmental standards, as required by section 1 of this 2009 Act, shall be deposited in the Healthy School Buildings Fund.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> The requirements of section 1 of this 2009 Act first apply to construction projects that are approved by a district school board on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.
