House Bill 3360

Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Oregon Cattlemen's Association)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires State Department of Agriculture to study need, feasibility and costs of providing state meat inspection service for deliveries of not more than 50 livestock animals. Requires department to report study findings to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than November 1, 2010.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to meat inspection.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The State Department of Agriculture shall conduct a study to determine the need, feasibility and costs of providing a state meat inspection service for custom slaughtering establishments and slaughterhouses processing a delivery of 50 or fewer livestock animals. In conducting the study, the department shall solicit comments from interested parties, including but not limited to livestock producers, custom slaughtering establishments, slaughterhouses and meat sellers.
 - (2) The department shall issue a report of its findings as provided under ORS 192.230 to 192.250 to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly dealing with agriculture no later than November 1, 2010.

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
