## House Bill 3422

Sponsored by Representative KAHL; Representatives BERGER, DEMBROW, GALIZIO, SCHAUFLER, SHIELDS, WITT

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires Department of Transportation to make certain information concerning public contracts available on publicly accessible website.

A	<b>BILL</b>	FOR	AN	ACT

- 2 Relating to Department of Transportation public contracts.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Transportation shall make available by means of a searchable and publicly accessible website the following information for each contract that the department awards:
      - (a) The name of the contractor to which the department awarded the contract;
      - (b) The original amount of the contractor's bid;
    - (c) The final contract price after accounting for change orders, amendments or other alterations to the scope of work under the contract, along with the cost of the change order, amendment or alteration to the scope of work;
    - (d) Whether the department awarded the contract by competitive bid and the number of bids the department received;
    - (e) Whether the department received a bid from and awarded the contract to a bidder that was a minority or women business enterprise or an emerging small business, as those terms are defined in ORS 200.005;
      - (f) The identification number for the contract;
      - (g) The names of the contractor's subcontractors;
    - (h) The original contract term, whether amendments extended the original term and the date on which the amended contract term expires; and
    - (i) If the contract is a personal services contract, the cost the department incurred for the contract and the cost the department would have incurred to perform the same services using the department's own resources or personnel.
    - (2) The department shall ensure that the information described in subsection (1) of this section is searchable by means of keywords, categories, subjects or other means intended to enable a person to readily access the categories of information described in subsection (1) of this section.
      - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act applies to:
    - (1) Contracts that the Department of Transportation advertised or otherwise solicited or entered into within a period that begins two calendar years before the effective date of this 2009 Act and ends on the effective date of this 2009 Act; and
