## House Bill 3447

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON RULES

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes nonmotorized boat registration and permit system.
Sets registration, renewal and other fees.
Punishes violation by maximum of $\$ 90$ fine.
Becomes operative on January 1, 2012.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to nonmotorized boat registration; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 830.990.
Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
SECTION 1. Sections 2 to 6 of this 2009 Act are added to and made a part of ORS chapter 830.

SECTION 2. As used in sections 2 to 6 of this 2009 Act:
(1) "Nonmotorized boat" does not include:
(a) A sailboat that is $\mathbf{1 2}$ feet or more in length.
(b) A nonmotorized boat owned and operated by the United States or by an entity or political subdivision of the United States or a state.
(c) A boat not owned in this state operated only temporarily in the waters of this state.
(d) A ship's lifeboat used solely for lifesaving purposes.
(2) "Nonmotorized boat permit" or "permit" means a document that displays a unique registration number and registration expiration date and that is issued upon registration of a nonmotorized boat.
(3) "Operate" has the meaning given the term in ORS 830.700.
(4) "Owner" has the meaning given the term in ORS 830.700.

SECTION 3. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, a person shall register each nonmotorized boat the person owns and operates on the waters of this state under this section and:
(a) Conspicuously display a nonmotorized boat permit sticker on the nonmotorized boat; or
(b) Carry a nonmotorized boat permit card on the nonmotorized boat.
(2) A nonmotorized boat owned by two or more persons must be registered by only one of the owners.

SECTION 4. (1) A nonmotorized boat registration application must include the following information:
(a) The name of the owner of the nonmotorized boat;
(b) The owner's address and telephone number; and
(c) Any other information the State Marine Board considers necessary.

NOTE: Matter in boldfaced type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in boldfaced type.
(2) The board by rule shall prescribe the forms to be used for the nonmotorized boat registration, registration renewals, forms to be submitted to the board by the agent collecting the permit fees and any other forms the board determines are necessary.
(3) The board shall issue one permit for each nonmotorized boat registered under section 3 of this 2009 Act.
(4) A nonmotorized boat permit must be in the form of a sticker that may attach to a nonmotorized boat or a card that may be carried on the boat.
(5) A person registering a nonmotorized boat may choose to have the permit issued in either sticker or card form.

SECTION 5. (1) The State Marine Board may appoint agents to receive nonmotorized boat registration applications and to issue nonmotorized boat permits.
(2) Agents shall issue permits in accordance with procedures prescribed by the board by rule and shall charge and collect the permit fees prescribed by law.
(3) The board may authorize an agent other than a board employee to charge a service fee of $\$ 2.50$, in addition to the nonmotorized boat permit fee, for the issuance service performed by the agent.
(4) The board shall supply the agents with nonmotorized boat registration application forms, nonmotorized permit stickers and cards and any other forms the board determines are necessary.

SECTION 6. (1) The biennial fee for issuance or renewal of a nonmotorized boat permit is $\mathbf{\$ 5 0}$.
(2) The biennial fee for issuance or renewal of a nonmotorized boat permit is $\$ 300$ for an owner who owns five or more nonmotorized boats and who is:
(a) An outfitter and guide, as defined in ORS 704.010 or an ocean guide, as defined in ORS 704.010; or
(b) An outdoor recreation group or organization.
(3) The fees described in subsections (1) and (2) of this section do not apply to the fifth or any additional nonmotorized boats owned at any one time by an individual required to hold a nonmotorized boat permit or to register under section 3 of this 2009 Act.
(4) The fees described in subsections (1) and (2) of this section do not apply to persons younger than 13 years of age or 65 years of age or older who own one or more nonmotorized boats.

SECTION 7. The State Marine Board shall adopt rules for the implementation and administration of sections 2 to 6 of this 2009 Act. Nothing in sections 2 to 6 of this 2009 Act prevents the board from contracting any service provided under sections 2 to 6 of this 2009 Act to any private person or entity or other unit of government.

SECTION 8. ORS 830.990 is amended to read:
830.990. (1) A person who violates ORS 830.050, 830.088, 830.090, 830.092, 830.094, 830.230, $830.415,830.710,830.720,830.770,830.780,830.810,830.850$ or 830.855 or section 3 of this 2009 Act, or rules adopted to carry out the purposes of those statutes, commits a Class D violation.
(2) A person who violates ORS 830.220, 830.240, 830.245, 830.250, 830.375, 830.475 (4), 830.480, $830.785,830.805$ or 830.825 , or rules adopted to carry out the purposes of those statutes, commits a Class C violation.
(3) A person who violates ORS 830.110, 830.175, 830.180, 830.185, 830.195, 830.210, 830.215, $830.225,830.235,830.260,830.300,830.315$ (2) and (3), $830.335,830.340,830.345,830.350,830.355$,
$830.360,830.362,830.365,830.370,830.410,830.420,830.495,830.775,830.795$ or 830.830 , or rules adopted to carry out the purposes of those statutes, commits a Class B violation.
(4) A person who violates ORS 830.305 or 830.390 , or rules adopted to carry out the purposes of those statutes, commits a Class A violation.
(5) A person who violates ORS 830.383 or 830.909 commits a Class B misdemeanor.
(6) A person who violates ORS 830.035 (2), $830.053,830.315$ (1), $830.325,830.475$ (1), 830.730 or 830.955 (1) commits a Class A misdemeanor.
(7) A person who violates ORS 830.475 (2) commits a Class C felony.

SECTION 9. (1) Sections 1 to 7 of this 2009 Act and the amendments to ORS 830.990 by section 8 of this 2009 Act become operative on January 1, 2012.
(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, prior to January 1, 2012 the State Marine Board may adopt rules and take all other measures determined by the board to be necessary for implementation of sections 1 to 7 of this 2009 Act and the amendments to ORS 830.990 by section 8 of this 2009 Act on January 1, 2012.
