House Bill 3470

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Defines "veteran" for purposes of section 3, Article XI-A of Oregon Constitution. Takes effect only if amendment to Oregon Constitution by House Joint Resolution 7 (2009) changing eligibility requirements for loan from Oregon War Veterans' Fund is approved by people at next general election. Takes effect on January 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to veterans; and prescribing an effective date.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. As used in section 3, Article XI-A of the Oregon Constitution, "veteran" 4 $\mathbf{5}$ means a person who:

6 (1) Served on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States:

7 (a) For a period of more than 90 consecutive days beginning on or before January 31,

8 1955, and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions;

9 (b) For a period of more than 178 consecutive days beginning after January 31, 1955, and 10 was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions;

11 (c) For 178 days or less and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable 12conditions because of a service-connected disability;

(d) For 178 days or less and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable 13 14 conditions and has a disability rating from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs; or 15

16 (e) For at least one day in a combat zone and was discharged or released from active duty 17 under honorable conditions;

18 (2) Received a combat, expeditionary or campaign ribbon or medal for service in the Armed Forces of the United States and was discharged or released from active duty under 19 20 honorable conditions; or

21(3) Is receiving a nonservice-connected pension from the United States Department of 22Veterans Affairs.

23SECTION 2. This 2009 Act does not take effect unless the amendment to the Oregon 24 Constitution proposed by House Joint Resolution 7 (2009) is approved by the people at the 25 next regular general election held throughout this state. If House Joint Resolution 7 (2009) 26 is approved by the people, this 2009 Act takes effect on January 1, 2011.
