HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3483

On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the line and lines 1 $\mathbf{2}$ 3 through 15 and insert "and declaring an emergency.". 3 Delete lines 17 through 29 and delete pages 2 through 41 and insert: "SECTION 1. For purposes of sections 2 to 7 of this 2009 Act: 4 5 "(1)(a) 'Economically distressed worker training' means: "(A) Training and education that provide occupation-specific skills required in high-6 demand occupations, as determined by the Director of the Employment Department; or 7 "(B) Retraining and basic education, including literacy skills, that are designed to prepare 8 9 an individual, within a reasonable period not to exceed two years, for gainful employment or 10 self-employment that is likely to become full-time employment paying at least 110 percent 11 of the minimum wage established under ORS 653.025. 12"(b) 'Economically distressed worker training' does not include programs of instruction 13 that are primarily intended to lead to a baccalaureate or higher degree, or training that 14 prepares individuals for employment in occupations that require a baccalaureate or higher 15degree, unless approved by the director. "(2) 'Eligible economically distressed workers' means individuals who: 16 17 "(a) Are unemployed as described in ORS 657.100; 18 "(b) Are eligible for benefits under ORS 657.150, unless otherwise disqualified under ORS 19 chapter 657; 20 "(c) Are not disqualified from benefits under any provision of ORS 657.176; and 21"(d) Have been employed in work paying less than 110 percent of the minimum wage established under ORS 653.025 during their entire base year. 2223 "SECTION 2. (1)(a) Eligible economically distressed workers enrolled or participating in 24 economically distressed worker training may not be denied unemployment insurance benefits 25solely because they are attending training. 26 (b) Eligible economically distressed workers approved for economically distressed 27worker training may not be denied unemployment insurance benefits for refusing to accept 28work if the work offered: 29 "(A) Is part-time or temporary or interferes with the eligible economically distressed 30 worker's training schedule; and 31"(B) Pays less than 110 percent of the minimum wage established under ORS 653.025. 32(2) Notwithstanding any provision of ORS chapter 657 relating to availability for work or actively seeking work, eligible economically distressed workers who are enrolled or par-33 34 ticipating in economically distressed worker training and who are otherwise eligible for un-35employment insurance benefits are not ineligible for benefits or waiting week credit because 1 of attendance in the training.

² <u>"SECTION 3.</u> The Director of the Employment Department, in consultation with the De-³ partment of Community Colleges and Workforce Development, shall adopt rules necessary ⁴ for the administration of sections 1 and 2 of this 2009 Act, including procedures for approval, ⁵ periodic review for continued approval, or disapproval of economically distressed worker ⁶ training for eligible economically distressed workers. The director shall ensure that all pro-⁷ grams for eligible economically distressed workers provide integrated and appropriate train-⁸ ing and education.

9 "SECTION 4. A base year employer's account may not be charged for benefits for economically distressed worker training paid under sections 1 and 2 of this 2009 Act. However, nothing in this section may be construed to relieve the state, reimbursing political subdivisions, reimbursing nonprofit employers or reimbursing Indian tribes from paying into the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund an amount equal to the benefits for economically distressed worker training paid under sections 1 and 2 of this 2009 Act.

15 "<u>SECTION 5.</u> Sections 1 and 2 of this 2009 Act apply to claims for benefits filed on or 16 after November 1, 2009.

"SECTION 6. Not later than March 1, 2011, the Director of the Employment Department
 shall submit to the Legislative Assembly a report on the operation of economically distressed
 worker training through January 31, 2011.

20 "<u>SECTION 7.</u> The total costs of benefits paid pursuant to section 2 of this 2009 Act may 21 not exceed \$9.2 million.

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"<u>SECTION 8.</u> (1) As used in this section:

"(a) 'Emergency benefit period' means a period beginning October 4, 2009, and ending on
January 2, 2010.

25 "(b) 'Oregon emergency benefits' means unemployment benefits totally financed by the 26 state and payable under ORS chapter 657 to individuals described in subsection (2) of this 27 section during an emergency benefit period.

28 "(c) 'Regular benefits' has the meaning given that term in ORS 657.321.

"(2) During an emergency benefit period, an individual may receive Oregon emergency
 benefits in an amount equal to the weekly benefit amount of the individual's most recent
 regular unemployment benefit claim subject to the provisions of ORS chapter 657 if:

"(a) The individual has exhausted regular benefits under ORS chapter 657;

"(b) The individual is not eligible for any other unemployment benefits, including benefits
 provided under any federal law extending benefits beyond those provided for as regular ben efits;

"(c) The individual's benefit year expired on or after May 1, 2007; and

"(d) The individual otherwise continues to meet the eligibility requirements for regular
 benefits under ORS chapter 657.

"(3) The maximum Oregon emergency benefits an individual may receive under this sec tion is 50 percent of the individual's most recent regular Oregon unemployment benefit
 claim.

42 "(4) The Employment Department may not charge an employer's account for benefits 43 paid to an unemployed individual under this section. However, nothing in this section may 44 be construed to relieve the state, reimbursing political subdivisions, reimbursing nonprofit 45 employers or reimbursing Indian tribes from paying into the Unemployment Compensation 1 Trust Fund an amount equal to the Oregon emergency benefits paid to an unemployed indi-

2 vidual under this section.

"(5) The provisions of this section apply only for weeks beginning October 4, 2009, and
ending January 2, 2010.

⁵ "<u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding section 8 of this 2009 Act, the Director of the Employment
⁶ Department may immediately stop payments of Oregon emergency benefits when the direc⁷ tor determines that the total amount of payments made pursuant to section 8 of this 2009
⁸ Act would exceed \$30 million if paid for the succeeding calendar week.

9 "<u>SECTION 10.</u> Sections 1 to 9 of this 2009 Act are repealed on January 2, 2012.

"SECTION 11. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect
on its passage.".

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
