SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Modifies definition of "child care facility" and creates definitions for "preschool recorded program" and "record" for purposes related to regulation of child care facilities.

Creates provisions relating to operation and regulation of preschool recorded programs, including procedure by which preschool recorded program may obtain recording. Imposes maximum civil penalty of \$100 on person who violates specified provision.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 657A.250 is amended to read:

6 657A.250. As used in ORS 657A.030 and 657A.250 to 657A.450, unless the context requires otherwise:
7

8 (1) "Babysitter" means a person who goes into the home of a child to give care during the
9 temporary absence of the parent or legal guardian or custodian.

10 (2) "Certification" means the certification that is issued under ORS 657A.280 by the Child Care
11 Division to a family child care home, child care center or other child care facility.

12 (3) "Child" means a child under 13 years of age or a child under 18 years of age who has special
13 needs or disabilities and requires a level of care that is above normal for the child's age.

14 (4) Subject to ORS 657A.440, "child care" means the care, supervision and guidance on a regular
15 basis of a child, unaccompanied by a parent, guardian or custodian, provided to a child during a part
16 of the 24 hours of the day, in a place other than the child's home, with or without compensation.
17 "Child care" does not include care provided:

18 (a) In the home of the child;

19 (b) By the child's parent, guardian, or person acting in loco parentis;

20 (c) By a person related to the child by blood or marriage within the fourth degree as determined
21 by civil law;

22 (d) On an occasional basis by a person not ordinarily engaged in providing child care;

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 (e) By providers of medical services;

2 (f) By a babysitter;

3 (g) By a person who cares for children from only one family other than the person's own family;

4 (h) By a person who cares for no more than three children other than the person's own children;

5 or

6 (i) By a person who is a member of the child's extended family, as determined by the division
7 on a case-by-case basis.

8 (5) "Child care facility" means any facility that provides child care to children, including a day
9 nursery, nursery school, child care center, certified or registered family child care home or similar
10 unit operating under any name, but not including any:

11 (a) [*Facility providing care that is primarily educational, unless provided to a preschool child for*
12 *more than four hours a day*] **Preschool recorded program.**

13 (b) Facility providing care **for school-age children** that is primarily [*supervised training in a*
14 *specific subject, including but not limited to dancing, drama, music or religion.*] **a single enrichment**
15 **activity, for eight hours or less a week.**

16 (c) Facility providing care that is primarily [*an incident of*] group athletic or social activities
17 sponsored by or under the supervision of an organized club or hobby group.

18 (d) Facility operated by:

19 (A) A school district as defined in ORS 332.002;

20 (B) A political subdivision of this state; or

21 (C) A governmental agency.

22 (e) Residential facility licensed under ORS 443.400 to 443.455.

23 (f) Babysitters.

24 (g) Facility operated as a parent cooperative for no more than four hours a day.

25 (h) Facility providing care while the child's parent remains on the premises and is engaged in
26 an activity offered by the facility or in other nonwork activity.

27 (6) "Division" means the Child Care Division of the Employment Department.

28 (7) "Family" has the meaning given that term in ORS 329.145.

29 (8) "Occasional" means that care is provided for no more than 70 days in any calendar year.

30 (9) "Parent cooperative" means a child care program in which:

31 (a) Care is provided by parents on a rotating basis;

32 (b) Membership in the cooperative includes parents;

33 (c) There are written policies and procedures; and

34 (d) A board of directors that includes parents of the children cared for by the cooperative con-
35 trols the policies and procedures of the program.

36 (10) "**Preschool recorded program**" means a facility providing care for preschool children
37 that is primarily educational for four hours or less per day and where no child is present at
38 the facility for more than four hours per day.

39 (11) "**Record**" means the record that is issued under section 4 of this 2009 Act to a pre-
40 school recorded program.

41 [(10)] (12) "Registration" means the registration that is issued under ORS 657A.330 by the Child
42 Care Division to a family child care home where care is provided in the family living quarters of
43 the provider's home.

44 [(11)] (13) "School age" means of an age eligible to be enrolled in the first grade or above and,
45 during the months of summer vacation from school, means of an age eligible to be enrolled in first

1 grade or above in the next school year.

33 **record application form and a nonrefundable fee as established by the division. The division**

27 which is designed to serve educational or other legitimate purposes; and

28 (ii) Allowing, permitting, encouraging or hiring a child to engage in prostitution, as defined in
29 ORS chapter 167.

30 (F) Negligent treatment or maltreatment of a child, including but not limited to the failure to
31 provide adequate food, clothing, shelter or medical care that is likely to endanger the health or
32 welfare of the child.

33 (G) Threatened harm to a child, which means subjecting a child to a substantial risk of harm
34 to the child's health or welfare.

35 (H) Buying or selling a person under 18 years of age as described in ORS 163.537.

36 (I) Permitting a person under 18 years of age to enter or remain in or upon premises where
37 methamphetamines are being manufactured.

38 (J) Unlawful exposure to a controlled substance, as defined in ORS 475.005, that subjects a child
39 to a substantial risk of harm to the child's health or safety.

40 (b) "Abuse" does not include reasonable discipline unless the discipline results in one of the
41 conditions described in paragraph (a) of this subsection.

42 (2) "Child" means an unmarried person who is under 18 years of age.

43 (3) "Public or private official" means:

44 (a) Physician, including any intern or resident.

45 (b) Dentist.

- 1 (c) School employee.
- 2 (d) Licensed practical nurse or registered nurse.
- 3 (e) Employee of the Department of Human Services, State Commission on Children and Families,
- 4 Child Care Division of the Employment Department, the Oregon Youth Authority, a county health
- 5 department, a community mental health and developmental disabilities program, a county juvenile
- 6 department, a licensed child-caring agency or an alcohol and drug treatment program.
- 7 (f) Peace officer.
- 8 (g) Psychologist.
- 9 (h) Member of the clergy.
- 10 (i) Licensed clinical social worker.
- 11 (j) Optometrist.
- 12 (k) Chiropractor.
- 13 (L) Certified provider of foster care, or an employee thereof.
- 14 (m) Attorney.
- 15 (n) Naturopathic physician.
- 16 (o) Licensed professional counselor.
- 17 (p) Licensed marriage and family therapist.
- 18 (q) Firefighter or emergency medical technician.
- 19 (r) A court appointed special advocate, as defined in ORS 419A.004.
- 20 (s) A child care provider registered or certified under ORS 657A.030 and 657A.250 to 657A.450.
- 21 (t) Member of the Legislative Assembly.

22 **(u) An operator of a preschool recorded program under section 4 of this 2009 Act.**
23 *[(u)]* (v) An operator of a school-age recorded program under *[section 4 of this 2009 Act]* **section**
24 **4, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2009 (Enrolled House Bill 2987).**

- 25 (4) “Law enforcement agency” means:
- 26 (a) Any city or municipal police department.
 - 27 (b) Any county sheriff’s office.
 - 28 (c) The Oregon State Police.
 - 29 (d) A county juvenile department.

30 **SECTION 11. (1) Section 4 of this 2009 Act and the amendments to ORS 419B.005, 657A.250**
31 **and 657A.275 by sections 1, 2, 6, 7, 8 and 10 of this 2009 Act apply to persons operating a**
32 **preschool recorded program on or after the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2009**
33 **Act.**

34 **(2) A person who is operating a program that would qualify as a preschool recorded**
35 **program under section 4 of this 2009 Act on the operative date specified in section 12 of this**
36 **2009 Act must record the program not later than 90 days after the operative date specified**
37 **in section 12 of this 2009 Act.**

38 **SECTION 12. Section 4 of this 2009 Act and the amendments to ORS 419B.005, 657A.250**
39 **and 657A.275 by sections 1, 2, 6, 7, 8 and 10 of this 2009 Act become operative on July 1, 2010.**

40 **SECTION 13. The Child Care Division of the Employment Department may take any**
41 **action before the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2009 Act necessary to enable**
42 **the division to implement the provisions of section 4 of this 2009 Act and the amendments**
43 **to ORS 419B.005, 657A.250 and 657A.275 by sections 1, 2, 6, 7, 8 and 10 of this 2009 Act on and**
44 **after the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2009 Act.**
